

GEN. TREVIÑO AS REVOLUTION HEAD

Proclamation Declares He and Orozco Will Lead the Hosts.

(Continued from Page 1.)

was put up they would accept him. The fact that they have proclaimed Gen. Treviño as their man for president and that he had already been suggested by the Mexico City contingent, leads to the belief that it is a compromise and that Madero is to get out.

Gen. Treviño is an aged army officer, over 70 years old, and is at present commander of the third Mexican military zone at Monterey. He has served his country long, is recognized as a capable man and a brave general, and is loved by many of the people of the country. A number of years ago he married an American woman, a daughter of Gen. E. O. G. Ord, at that time commanding the department of Texas. Gen. Ord is now dead.

The Proclamation. After accusing Madero of being a traitor to his country and false to his people in almost every conceivable particular, the authors of the remarkable circular say: "As the initiator of the revolution Francisco I. Madero has been false to the principles and has failed to carry out the provisions of the plan of San Luis Potosi.

Anti-American Sentiment. "Madero carried on his revolution with the aid of money furnished by American millionaires and with the indirect approval of the government of the United States, as has been demonstrated by many personal declarations made by Madero.

"Madero welcomed to the ranks of his army filibusters of American and other foreign nationalities, who were employed to murder our Mexican brethren.

"Debauching the Nation. "Madero robbed the nation of its best blood, by the removal of its chief officers from the service of the forces of the revolution.

"Madero debauched the nation, when by use of armed force he nullified the effect of the recent election and brought about his own election to the presidency and that of J. M. Pino Suarez to the vice presidency of the republic.

"Wall Street Millionaires. Paragraph 6 of the document is of much the same tenor as is paragraph 7, and paragraph 7 charges that within two days after his election he was paid \$1,000,000 by Wall Street millionaires under a pretext of using the money to improve the service of the national lines of Mexico.

"Madero is prejudicial to the nation and calculated to humiliate it in the eyes of the world, for he has placed in the hands of the United States the destinies of his country.

"Madero Traitor and Outlaw. "For the derelictions and crimes stated above Madero is proclaimed a traitor to his country and an outlaw.

The election of a vice president is declared a usurpation of authority not warranted by law and under the new revolution there will be no such officer.

Reforms Demanded. Much space is given to declarations of reforms which the new revolution will put in effect—of public utilities, State consular, of public utilities, particularly of railroads, is especially featured. The present inadequate system of popular education will be greatly improved, it is promised, and sweeping reforms in the administration of the land department will be inaugurated.

The authors conclude by alluding to the people, with special reference to the soldiers of the nation, to give their aid to the bringing about of an era of peace and prosperity by the overthrow of Madero and the election of Gen. Treviño to the presidency of the republic.

Not Credited in Capital. Mexico City, Mexico, Feb. 24.—Minister of foreign affairs, Geronimo Treviño had joined the revolutionists and expressed doubt of the truth of the story that Orozco had proved disloyal. His opinion was shared by other members of the cabinet.

Gonzales Is Skeptical. San Antonio, Tex., Feb. 24.—Enfillo Vasquez Gomez does not credit the report that Gen. Pascual Orozco has joined the rebel ranks. He would be believed the rumor would prove untrue.

SAYS MADERO IS CHARGED WITH BEING AN INGRATE. Madero the ingrate. That is the label James Brown, a merchant in Mexico, has attached to the former hero of the Mexican revolution, whose star is fading like a peroxide blonde in a shower.

Ingratitude is the undoing of the Mexican president, Cowan says. He arrives in El Paso Friday from a little trip through Mexico, which included a cruise down the west coast, a faint on a motorcycle across the border, and a brief trip back on the east coast from Tepic to the Rio Grande.

"You hear it in the clubs in Mexico City, you see it in the streets, and you listen to it over the strong Mexican coffee in the haciendas of the interior," Cowan says. "Madero is believed to be ungrateful to the friends who starred and strove and fought for him in the north when he was struggling to make his little revolution take its first infant steps."

ANTI-AMERICAN FEELING GROWS

Mexicans From Mexico in Upper Valley Cause Uneasiness.

Anti-American feeling continues to increase in the upper valley from Anthony, on the Texas-New Mexico state line, to Las Cruces, according to the American ranchers. They are arming themselves with rifles and automatic revolvers in order to be prepared for any trouble which may occur in case of intervention or an anti-American demonstration.

A shipment of 10 rifles was sent from El Paso to one of the valley towns Saturday, and by Monday practically every ranch house will be an arsenal, to be used in case of trouble. The Americans are arranging to send their families out of the valley should any signs of trouble occur and a number of women are now in El Paso from the upper valley ranches, where the Mexican population outnumbers the Americans in many instances.

An ugly incident occurred at the ranch of Noel Longmure near Monterey, according to one of the valley ranchers. Mexican "floaters" or transient laborers from the interior, applied for work. When the report reached there of the crossing by mistake of the detachment of the 13th infantry into Juarez, the men quit work and demanded their money.

Longmure was at the ranch alone and paid them off. As they left the ranch they shouted "Death to Americans," and other offensive names in Spanish against the Americans. When asked why they quit they said that they were going to fight the "gringos."

Another incident is reported from the same neighborhood in the lower Mesilla valley. One Mexican boasted that he could get 50 Mexicans, members of the famous "Bosque gang," which has terrorized the community here for a number of years, and each would pledge himself to kill two Americans and take as many horses as possible and then "beat it" across from Mexican consul E. C. Llorente

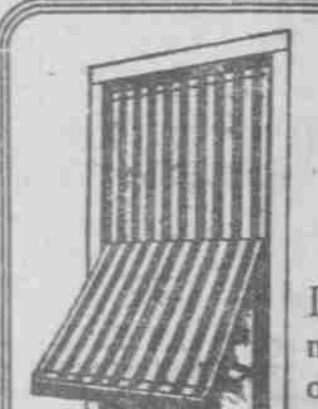

SWEETWATER LOSES HEADQUARTERS AFTER LONG LEGAL FIGHT. Austin, Tex., Feb. 24.—The attorney general's department today approved an amendment to the charter of the Kansas City, Mexico and Orient railway of Texas, providing for a change in the company's headquarters from Sweetwater to San Angelo. This means the end of much litigation on the part of the people of Sweetwater to resist the moving of the headquarters, but the last injunction against the company's change has been vacated, and the headquarters will now be at San Angelo.
