

J. A. ANKENBAUER BASE ON TRIAL

Man Charged With Shooting Harry Mahoney Pleads "Not Guilty" Friday.

J. A. Ankenbauer, charged with the murder of Harry W. Mahoney at the Ankenbauer home, 1209 Wyoming street, on December 22, was placed on trial in the 21st district court Friday morning.

The state's witnesses were examined during the morning and when the case was resumed Friday afternoon the examination of witnesses for the defense was taken up.

The jury in the case is composed of Guy O. Strickland, Charles S. Kranoz, J. R. Wall, Abe Levy, J. D. Dean, J. S. Merrill, C. W. Wilkins, H. G. Van Housen, J. C. Huff, Ed Thales, S. H. Sandell and Colonel Lewis.

The defendant entered a plea of not guilty. Mrs. Kate Price and her daughter, Margaret Price, neighbors of the Ankenbauer family, testified to having arrived at the home shortly after the shooting. They both testified that Ankenbauer had told them that he shot Mahoney because he was broken up over his family.

Said Not in Room. Sidney Benson and S. H. Yeater, mounted police officers who were sent to the Ankenbauer home as soon as the news of the tragedy reached the station, were both placed on the stand during the morning.

Office Yeater stated that "Ankenbauer told me that Mahoney had been shot by Mrs. Ankenbauer and that he was in the kitchen at the time."

The witness identified some papers found near the dead man. Mrs. P. N. Craver, another neighbor of the Ankenbauer family, testified to having reached the home shortly after the tragedy.

Mrs. Ankenbauer, who said, was fully dressed when she arrived on the scene and was suffering from poison.

Harry Hagston, an undertaker who prepared the body for burial, testified as to the wounds on the body of Mahoney.

The defendant made application for suspended sentence in case of conviction.

Slingsby Legitimacy Suit Ends; Decision Reserved. London, Eng., Jan. 22.—Arguments in the Slingsby legitimacy suit, which is based on the claim of Lieut. Chas. R. Slingsby of San Francisco.

The Slingsby suit involves the question whether the infant born in San Francisco and declared to be the lawful son of Chas. R. Slingsby and his wife, Dorothy, is the rightful successor to the valuable Slingsby estate.

Lieut. Slingsby inherited an English estate, but by a special provision an additional estate valued at \$100,000 was to go to his heir.

Mrs. Slingsby in 1910 gave birth to a child in San Francisco. Testimony taken before the district attorney of San Francisco tended to show that the Slingsby heir had died and that the Slingsby heir had been substituted. The suit was opened before the probate court in London, December 2.
