Flags Fly at Half Mast; Banks and City Hall Close For Funeral.

Funeral services for Felix Martinez were held Friday afternoon at the Martinez home in Tobin Place, starting at four o'clock.

The cottage on the Dunno Boulevard, where Mr. Martinez spent so many happy days with his family, his roses and his books, could hold but a small part of the guests for Friday.

A Mexican orchestra played softly "I Am a Pilgrim." Rev. Charles Leslie Overstreet read a passage from the scriptures, a quartet from the First Presbyterian church sang softly "It is Not Death to Us," Rev. Miles Hanson gave a brief, personal talk on the life of the deceased El Pasano, the quartet sang "My Love, My Love," there was a prayer, a benediction and the services were over.

Next came the honorary and active pall bearers, the active pall bearers walking beside the hearse. Automobiles followed the hearse in which the family and close friends of the deceased rode.

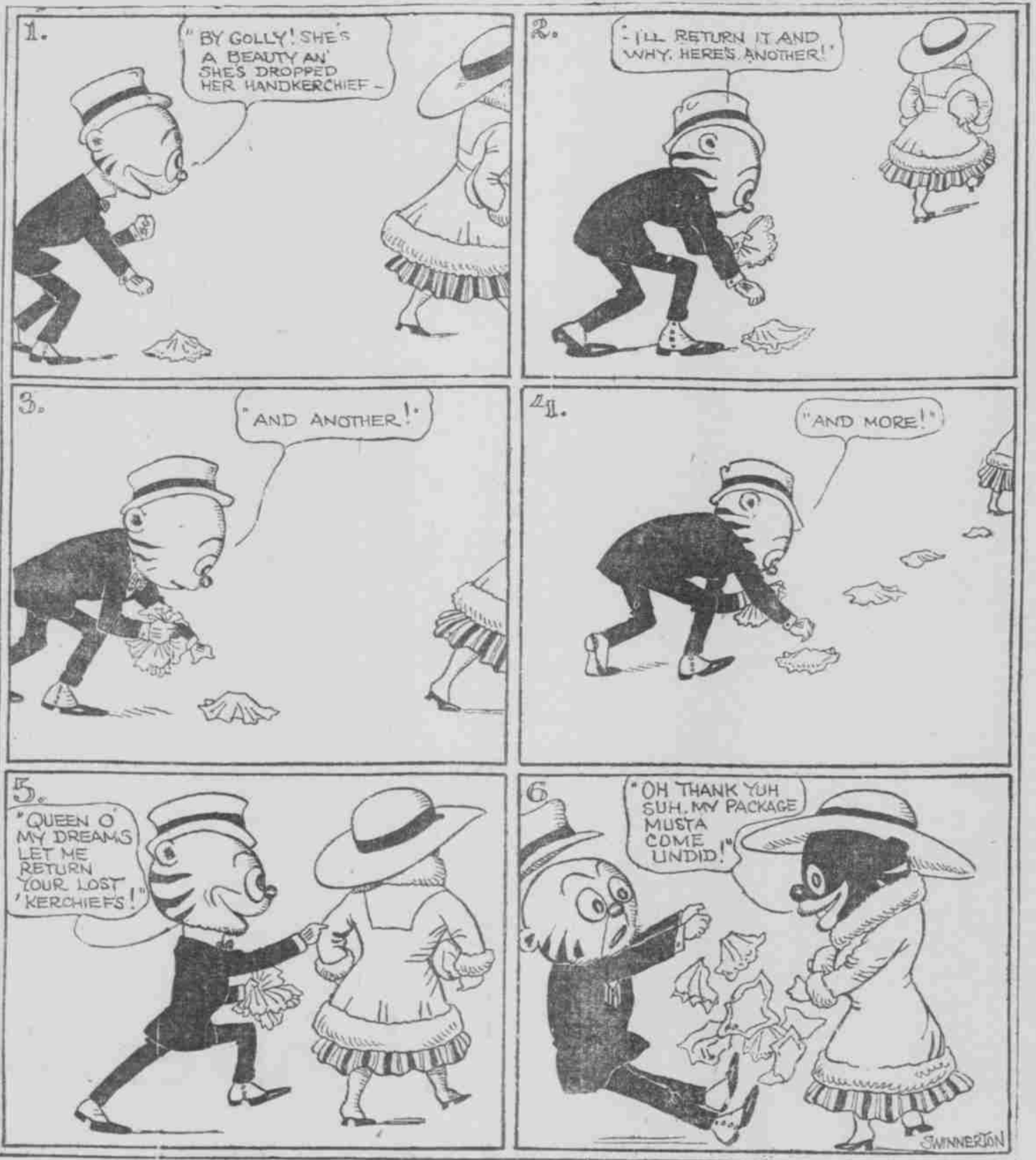

Dr. Husk contracted typhus, while in Mexico with the Mt. Sinai expedition to study typhus in the infected districts.
