9 MOTOR TRUCKS GO TO COLUMBUS

Carpenters Work at Night to Complete Them; Driven By Way of Las Cruces. Nine of the truck chassis which were shipped here from Chicago and Detroit Friday for the use of the U. S. army, were completed late Friday night and were sent west to Columbus Saturday morning...

Truck drivers who were brought from Chicago and Detroit and were not familiar with the roads. Owing to the bad condition of the Borderland Route west of Canutillo, the trucks were driven to Las Cruces and went from there to Columbus to avoid the desert hand on the Borderland. The remaining 15 trucks are to be sent out as soon as they are completed.
