

ARMY-NAVY PAY RAISE FAVORED

Washington, D. C., Jan. 18.—By a big majority, the house military affairs committee agreed to report favorably the bill granting an increase of 25 percent in the pay of all officers of the army, navy marine corps, public health service and coast guard up to and including the rank of brigadier general in the army and equivalent grades in other services.

The house naval affairs committee has agreed to increase in the pay of officers and men of the navy.

FRANCE PLANS AIRPLANE HUTS

Paris, France, Jan. 17.—Steps were taken by the cabinet today to stop the construction of the five G. F. 15 fighters of the Normandie class laid down just before the war but never completed. Other measures authorized will direct that the six scout cruisers provided by the law of 1912, as well as 12 scout destroyers, shall be laid down during 1934.

The plans for the Normandie class of dreadnaughts provided for vessels displacing 24,000 tons each with main batteries of twelve 12.1 inch guns and four 4.5 inch guns. Their construction was suspended not long after the outbreak of the war and their 12.1 inch guns were transferred to the army. The building of the dreadnaughts was resumed later.

Two Army Officers Honorably Discharged

Washington, D. C., Jan. 17.—Orders transferring Capt. Alfred T. Powell, infantry, from Green, N. C., to Whitehall barracks, have been revoked. Maj. David M. Speed, quartermaster corps, has been honorably discharged from Ft. Bliss, Capt. George P. Collier, field artillery, has been honorably discharged at Whitehall barracks.

AIRPLANE HUTS MOUNTAIN PEAK

Crashing into a snow capped mountain peak, hidden by a cloud bank, caused the airplane accident Sunday near Bernardino, Ariz., in which Lieut. Bruce Struthers, pilot of the 10th aero squadron, was instantly killed, and Lieut. J. Evans, observer, received injuries from which he may die.

The information has reached El Paso from Douglas, Ariz., through a seriously injured, told how the dead pilot attempted to escape the crash as he saw the peak, but that it was impossible because of engine trouble. Struthers was first against a boulder and was instantly killed.

London, Eng., Jan. 17.—A dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph from Cairo, dated January 16, says: "There has been serious fighting between French and Syrian volunteers at Margyun, where there were many casualties on both sides, and at Tallkha where the French suffered severely, and also fighting at Alexandria and other places on the demarcation line on the French zone in Damascus."

PREMIER OF GREECE SENDS THANKS TO U. S. CLERGYMEN

New York, Jan. 17.—Premier Venizelos of Greece, cabled his thanks for a message recently sent him by leading clergymen of Protestant churches in America endorsing the claims of Greece to southern Thrace and favoring the expulsion of the Turks from governmental control in Europe.

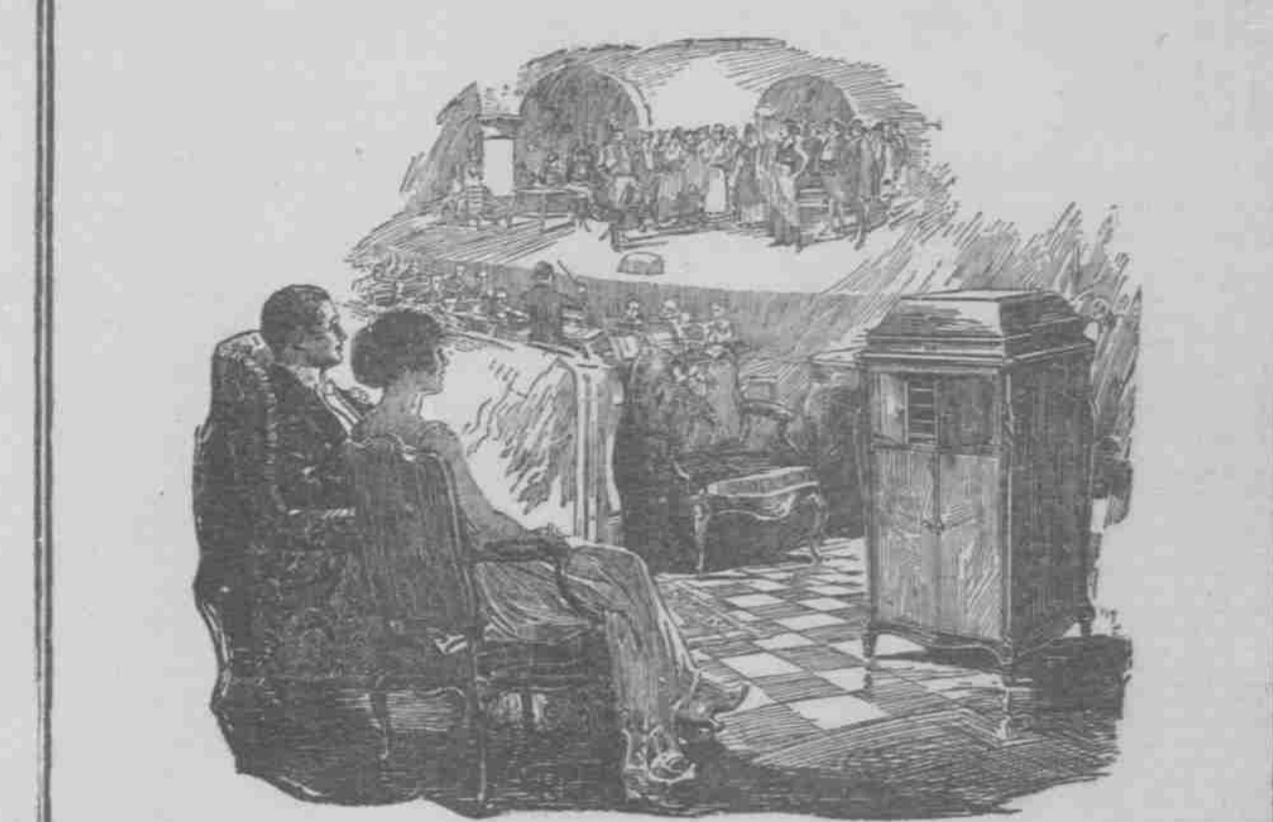
