EL PASO RESUME STRAP

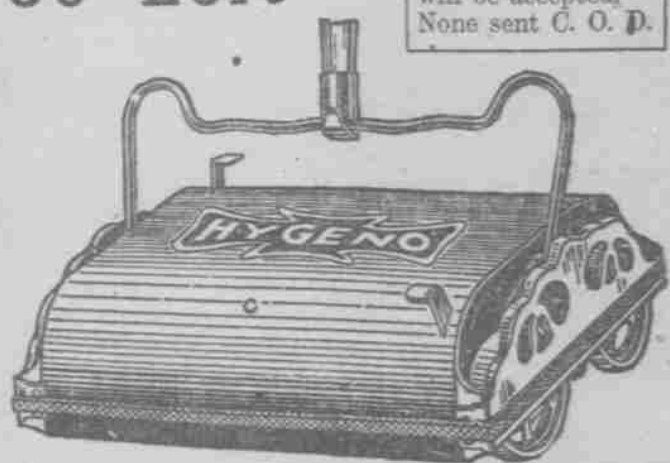

NO ACTUAL FIGURES ON TUBERCULOUS EX-SOLDIERS

Austin, Texas, May 6.—That there were "no actual figures obtainable from any source" to substantiate any representations that there were 4000 ex-servicemen suffering with tuberculosis in Texas, but that these figures were based on an estimate made by Maj. John M. Holt, surgeon United States public hospital service, addressed to the governor on October 20, 1919, are conclusions reached today by executive committee which investigated on Wednesday, the statement made by Thomas Dismuke, postmaster American Legion, at Houston, charging these figures.

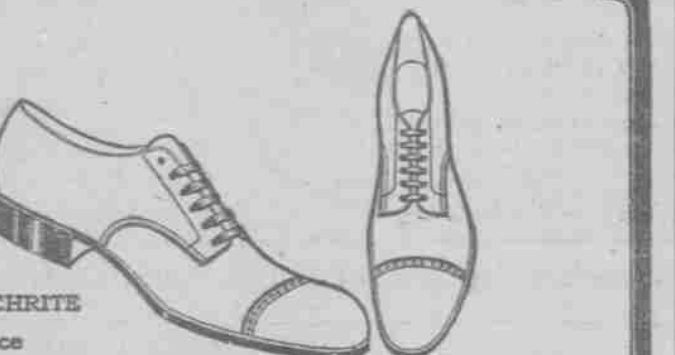
