

LETTERS OF THE CZARINA TO THE CZAR IN WAR TIME

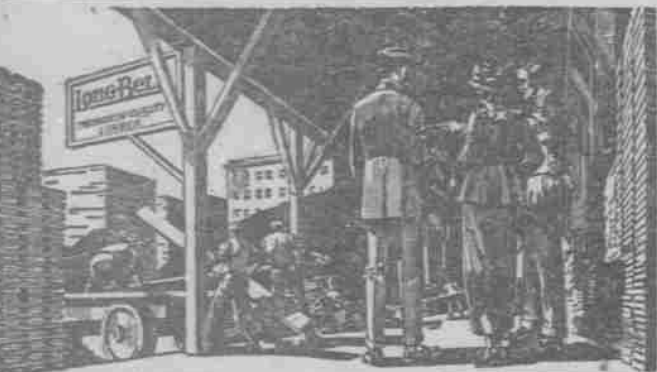
Empress Speaks of Plan to Remove Nicholas and Place Her in a Convent.

Urges Czar to Swallow Bottle of Wine From Rasputin's Feast for Health and Happiness.

ARTICLE XXX—PLAN TO REMOVE CZAR AND CZARINA.

That a coup d'etat was planned at the army headquarters by the friends of grand duke Nicholas, aiming to remove the czar and lock the czarina up in a convent, is disclosed for the first time in the letter of the czarina dated January 1 (21), 1918.

Cold Creams.

Further heating melted the wax, but the cream when cooled was thick, hard to spread, and only good to massage when I had my skin very hot from holding a hot wet towel over it. 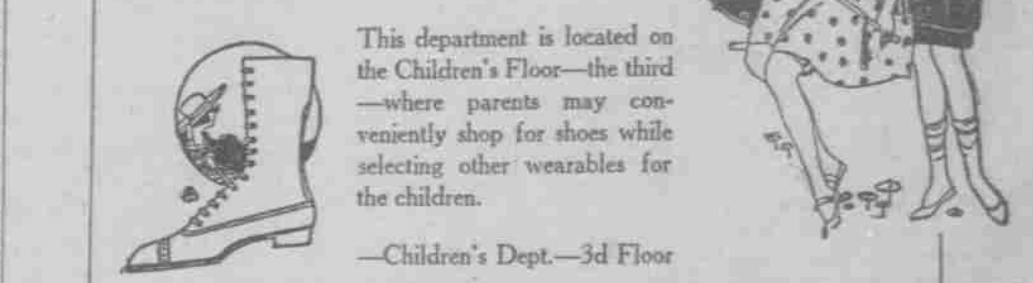
