Spencer's first professional engagement was with the Toronto club of the Inter-league in 1912. He then was a pitcher, as well as an outfielder, but his manager did not like him in the latter position for Spencer's name is not found in the pitching records which he has compiled. 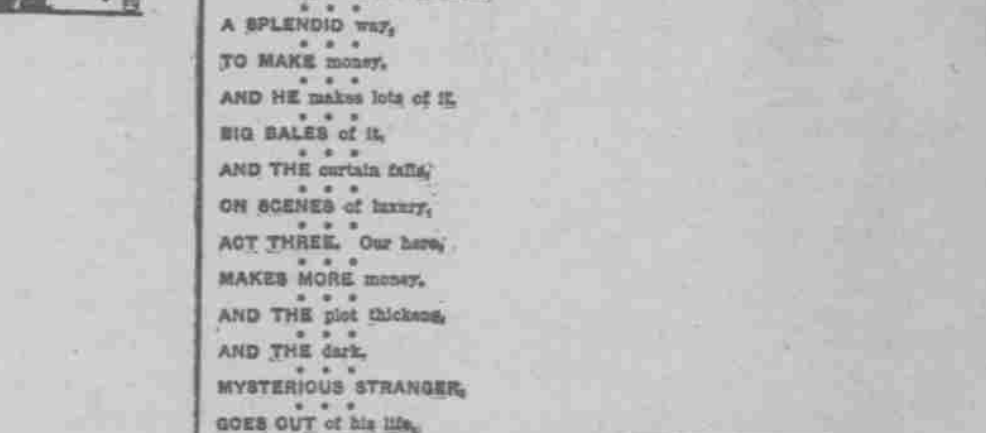
