## THE INCOMING MAN.

Queen Victoria Formally Accepts the Resignation of the Gladstone Ministry.

The Marquis of Salisbury, Leader of the Conservatives, is Summoned to Form a Government.

The New Party Goes in Divided and the Parnellites Will Hold the Balance of Power.

## GREAT BRITAIN.

**SALISBURY SUMMONED BY THE QUEEN.**  
LONDON, June 12, 3 P. M.—It has just been learned from an authoritative source that the report to the effect that the marquis of Salisbury had been summoned by the queen to Balmoral, and that he left last night for the castle, is true. The marquis started secretly at midnight for Balmoral.

**HOME RULE FOR IRELAND.**  
Now that it has become apparent by the departure of the marquis of Salisbury for Balmoral that the Tories will assume the reins of government, the Parnellite members of parliament have begun conferring with the leading Conservatives with regard to the government of Ireland. Parnell and his followers strongly urge the Tories to adopt a home-rule measure for Ireland, stating that the advocacy of such a step by the Conservatives would completely disable the Liberals.

**THE RESIGNATION ACCEPTED.**  
The queen has accepted the resignation of the Gladstone ministry and has summoned the earl of Salisbury to form a new cabinet.

**SALISBURY RELUCTANT TO GO IN.**  
It was reported to-day in certain circles that the marquis of Salisbury after consultation with the Conservative leaders had decided to advise that efforts be made to induce Mr. Gladstone to reconsider his resolve to resign, and should these efforts fail then to suggest that Sir Stafford Northcote be called upon to form a cabinet.

**THE CONSERVATIVES DISUNITED.**  
Lord Salisbury at an informal conference with a number of Conservative members of the house of commons before departing for Balmoral said he would refuse office unless assured by the Liberal leaders that the factions of opposition would not hamper the administration. If the Liberal majority were to give fair play to a Conservative ministry the office might be accepted. Without such an understanding between the leaders of both sides it would be impossible for the Conservatives to undertake the government.

Mr. Joseph Chamberlain's organ, the Birmingham Post, to-day describes the Radical policy in the event of a Tory ministry being formed. "They must," the Post says, "be watched, checked, forbidden to legislate and compelled to explain and justify every step, and so bound, limited and prevented from using for their own purposes the positions to which they have no claim."

These and similar declarations by other Liberal papers intensify the feelings of the rank and file of the Conservatives against accepting office as impossible, without guarantees of some support at the hands of the moderate Liberals. The queen is in telegraphic consultation with

and several members of the privy council. This is the first time she has sought advice of the prince in a state crisis. It is reported that he advised the queen to follow the constitutional practice and call the marquis of Salisbury to form a new cabinet. If a Tory cabinet is formed Mr. Gladstone's immediate retirement from public life is certain and the marquis of Hartington will be left to lead the opposition. The news that Mr. Gladstone intends to make his retirement coincident with his resignation dismays the liberals who relied upon his leadership in the coming electoral campaign.

**AN OVATION TO SALISBURY.**  
The queen is expected to arrive at Windsor castle from Balmoral on Tuesday next.  
Telegrams from all the principal points along the route taken by the marquis of Salisbury to Balmoral show that the journey was made through a continued series of popular ovations. On that part of the way which lies in Scotland crowds of people assembled at the railway and cheered the "incoming man." At Aberdeen the demonstration was particularly enthusiastic. Here some one called out three cheers for Gladstone, and the invitation was greeted with groans and hisses.

The marquis of Salisbury has consented to form a ministry with Sir Stafford Northcote as chancellor of the exchequer.

## IN PARLIAMENT.

**THE HOUSE OF LORDS.**  
LONDON, June 12.—In the house of lords this afternoon Lord Granville announced that Mr. Gladstone had tendered to the queen the resignation of himself and his entire cabinet. Lord Granville also stated that the queen had accepted their resignations and had summoned to her presence the marquis of Salisbury, who is now at Balmoral in conference with her majesty. Therefore Lord Granville said he hoped the house would abandon all ordinary business.

The remainder of the session was occupied in reading for the third time the redistribution of seats bill and passing the amendments thereto.

**IN THE COMMONS.**  
Mr. Gladstone announced in the house of commons this afternoon that he had resigned office, that the queen had accepted his resignation, and that her majesty had informed him she had summoned the marquis of Salisbury, leader of the opposition in the house of lords, to Balmoral for the purpose of intrusting him with the formation of a new ministry.

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
