

A DAY IN THE COURTS

A BIG RIOT IN CHINA. It is said that One Thousand People Were Killed in Chi Li. Peking, March 29.—Chinese officials say that 1000 people have been killed in riots at Ta Ming Fu, the southernmost prefecture of the province. The riot was caused by an exaggeration, but the loss of life was undoubtedly great.

The riots were due to attempts of a local official to collect indemnities for the victims as arranged between the officials and the priests. The officials warn the missionaries to keep out of the disturbed districts. Such resistance is to be expected if indemnity claims are to be expected. It is estimated that the population in poor and wretched districts is 100,000.

HEAVY SNOWSTORM. It is believed that Missouri and Kansas Wheat Fields Will Be Benefited. Kansas City, Mo., March 29.—A heavy snowstorm has prevailed in Western Missouri and most of Kansas since midnight.

The snow falls in immense flakes, which dissolve almost as soon as they reach the earth. Winter wheat and pasturage will be benefited, but the mercury has not fallen below 38 degrees.

Forced into Bankruptcy. Alvin, Texas, March 29.—Deputy United States Marshal E. S. Darrah came up from Galveston this afternoon and took charge of the S. F. Smiley & Co. stock of dry
