PREPARING FOR FLIGHT.

France Providing Means for Evacuation of Martinique

IN EVENT IT BECOMES NECESSARY.

Reply Has Not Yet Been Received to the Message Which Was Sent by the Minister.

Paris, May 22.—The minister of the colonies, M. De Crais, has cabled to Governor L'Huere at Fort de France instructing him to make all possible arrangements for the embarkation of the inhabitants of Martinique in the event of circumstances necessitating the evacuation of that island.

The ministry of the colonies has communicated to the Associated Press the following cable message sent to Governor L'Huere yesterday evening: "Make known, if the situation seems to you to necessitate partial or total evacuation of the island, the means at your disposal and those you may need."

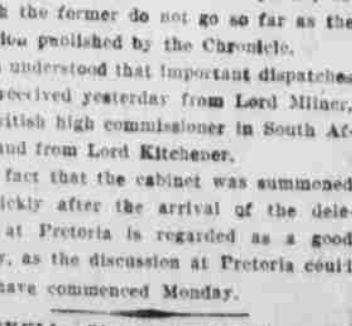
