HOW IS THIS FOR FIELDING?

Cleveland's Baseball Indians Have Played Twenty-one Errorless Games Up to Date.

New York Journal.

While four clubs are fighting tooth and nail for supremacy in the National league, one of them, Cleveland, leads the organization in fielding and has not been equalled since the league was put together.

Since the season began, and up to Saturday, Oliver Tebeau's tribe of Indians, Weary Williams, Outcasts, Wanderers, or whatever one chooses to call them since they have left home, have played eighty-five games. Out of this bunch they have played twenty-one, nearly one-quarter of the whole, without an error. In days gone by when nine played one game without an error it was good for at least one-quarter of a column in nearly every newspaper in the United States. Cleveland has not only played that one, but twenty more.

It would be perfectly unreasonable to expect Cleveland to play every game without an error, and it seems almost impossible that the nine, in addition to playing twenty-one errorless games, should have played twenty-one other games with only one error each. That, however, is just what it has done.

On top of that the Clevelanders have played sixteen games with only two errors each. In only thirteen games during the year have the errors been numerically greater than three. In most of the thirteen Cleveland made but four errors. The most errors made in any one game by these fielding experts have been eight, against the Chicagos at Chicago.

Verily the nimble men of the diamond are becoming so expert in grabbing grounders and nipping flies that it is an extremely fortunate slugger who can slug beyond their reach.

However, it is likely to be a long time before any ball team makes quite the record that Cleveland has made up to date. If the Indians persist in their ambition to keep the score as clean as possible they will make their exit at the conclusion of the season of 1898 with a halo of fielding glory that will reach from the home plate to centre field and back again.
