That the A. & M. College Has Outgrown its Facilities For Taking Care of the Hundreds of Texas Boys Who Seek Its Advantages.

The Eagle presents this morning the roster of students matriculated for the current term in the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Texas. The institution is in a flourishing condition and enjoys widespread popularity extending beyond the borders of the state. Indeed, so great have the demands grown upon it, as we have frequently taken occasion to note lately, that the barracks are wholly inadequate to accommodate more than half of those who desire to attend, notwithstanding the equipment in other respects is practically sufficient for a largely increased attendance. The press of the state could not render a better service than by impressing this condition properly upon those who will comprise the next legislature, so that the matter may be remedied as speedily as possible. The future looks particularly bright for the college, and influences seem to be uniting in its behalf in a way that must be truly gratifying to those who have its management in hand. Col. L. L. The board of directors are liberal and progressive and have a thorough understanding of the important work devolving upon them. The Alumni Association and Alpha Phi fraternity cannot be praised too much for their laudable and unceasing efforts in behalf of the college, and among the last but by no means the least potent influence set in motion is the Farmers Congress inaugurated by Prof. Connell, the influence of which upon the agricultural interests of the state and incidentally upon the work of the institution will be far reaching and incalculable for good. The personnel of the student body is of a high order, the young men presenting an intelligent and manly appearance, and evincing an interest in their work and marked appreciation of their advantages.

## ANOTHER IMPORTANT MEETING AT PARIS.

It is the Court of Arbitration to settle the Dispute between Great Britain and Venezuela.

Washington, Sept. 24. - The approaching meeting at Paris of the British-Venezuela court of arbitration, at which Chief Justice Fuller and Justice Brewer are arbitrators in behalf of the republic, will be hardly second in importance to the United States and Great Britain dividing Cleveland's administration and the content in which the Monroe doctrine is involved.

The president plans for the court to hold a preliminary session in January at which time Justice Brewer will go to Paris, but Chief Justice Fuller is not likely to go to the first meeting as the United States supreme court will be very busy about that time, and members of the bench cannot be spared at the same time. Justice Brewer will probably arrange a postponement until May, at which time both he and the chief justice will be free to join other arbitrators to take up the serious business of the commission.

## Another Case at Jackson.

Jackson, Miss., Sept. 24. - Another case of yellow fever has appeared at Jackson. The patient is a 15-year-old messenger by the name of Harry Wright, employed by the Western Union Telegraph company. He lives fully a quarter of a mile from the former case of infection.

Dr. Purnell, the state health officer, has issued a proclamation advising the total depopulation of the town. Preparations are now being made to send out a special trainload of refugees. The infected house are surrounded by a strong cordon of guards.

## Challenges American Wrestlers.

New York, Sept. 24. - Abdul Halil Adali, the champion wrestler of Turkey, who has just arrived here, has issued a sweeping challenge to American wrestlers. He is willing to meet any man for the championship of America, on a side stake of \$500 or \$1000, either Greek-Roman or catch-as-catch-can style. He prefers Ernest Roeder, and says he will throw Casper Mueller four times within an hour's time.
