MAY AFFECT ARANSAS PASS

Engineer Haupt Sues for an Injunction

Alleges that Patent for Jetty Plan Belongs to Him, and Demands Pay for His Patent, Before the Government Uses It.

Lewis M. Haupt, the Philadelphia civil engineer, has filed suit for injunction against General McKenzie, chief of engineers, and David M. Picton, a contractor, to restrain them from proceeding with the harbor improvement work at Aransas Pass, Tex., because of alleged use in connection with the work of his patent. Secretary Taft, General McKenzie and Picton are cited to appear before Justice Gould of the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia January 24, to show cause why the injunction asked by Mr. Haupt should not be granted.

Professor Haupt, who is the originator of the single jetty plan, at Aransas Pass, alleges that after the Aransas Pass Harbor Company failed to deepen the pass it transferred its contract to the Federal Government, the transfer including the Haupt plan. He claims the private company had no right to transfer his plan, which had been patented to him, hence the suit. He asks for an injunction until Congress appropriates a sum of money to pay him for use of his patent.

GREGORIO DUFFY MURDER CASE.

One of Accused Forfeited His Bond. Severance Ordered and Trial of Juan Morales Begins Tomorrow.

Laredo, Texas, Jan. 14.—The case of Gabriel Morales and Juan Morales, jointly indicted for the murder of Gregorio Duffy, customs inspector, who was killed at Rio Grande last April, which is set for hearing at this term of the Webb county district court, was called today. It developed that Gabriel Morales had forfeited his bond, and only Juan Morales appeared for trial. The court ordered severance in the case, and the trial of Juan Morales will begin tomorrow. The state is represented by District Attorney Valls of Laredo and Assistant U. S. Attorney Allen of Brownsville. Judge Wells and Hon. J. T. Canales of Brownsville, and also Lawyers Pierce and Hamilton of this place are retained for the defense. Many witnesses in the case are in attendance.

BROWNSVILLE RIFLES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

Adjutant General Will Come Later Part of Month to Muster In Company.

A telegram was received by Lieut. Head of the newly organized Brownsville Rifles Saturday evening, from E. M. Phelps, assistant adjutant general of Texas, notifying him that the company would be accepted, conditioned to be mustered in the last of this month. A letter followed the telegram from the same official, which was received by Lieut. Head yesterday, in which the assistant adjutant says, that the adjutant general is at present absent from the state, attending a meeting of the National Guard Association at Boston, and for that reason it will not be possible to muster in the company before the latter part of this month, when the general will return.

The writer adds: "I am glad to see from examination of your papers that you have the cordial support of the citizenship of Brownsville, and will start out with at least the minimum (58) of enlisted men."

All necessary blanks for the enlistment of the men and their muster into military service, the letter says, will be sent as soon as Gen Newton returns.

Lieut. Head says he expects Gen. Newton to come down in person to muster in the company and see that it is properly started.

BOTH FACTIONS WANT PEACE.

According to a recent dispatch from San Antonio, Friends of both factions are endeavoring to bring about some sort of treaty of peace between the Bailey and anti-Bailey men of this state. It is said that Senator Bailey will shortly issue from Washington a conciliatory address, and some of his friends indicate that, although he will defend himself if attacked, he will not carry the war into the enemy's camp quite so violently. It is even said that he will not fight the reelection of members of the last legislature who voted against him, if they will drop further hostilities. Democratic leaders are anxious for peace, because if the Bailey
