NO MATERIAL CHANGE IN GOVERNOR'S RACE

Hobby Now Has a Lead of 193,569 With Late Returns Constantly Increasing His Majority That May Go To 300,000; Davidson, Greenwood, Cureton, Lattimore, Edwards and Davis Are Leading

Further returns from Saturday's election show no material change in the governor's race, Hobby now leads over Ferguson by 193,569 votes. Figures from 1,274 precincts over the State show the following figures:

In the race for lieutenant governor Davidson continues to lead with 77,733, this being 261 more votes than credited to Johnson, whose count at the last tabulation was 77,472. Moore is fifth with 65,939, Henderson fourth with 61,416 and Howell and Bailey fifth and sixth with 48,007 and 50,160, respectively.

Judge Greenwood continues to lead in the contest for Associate Judge of the Supreme Court, returns from 2,690 precincts giving the results as follows:

Two thousand one hundred and twenty precincts, 2999 Mrs. Annie Blanton 206,791 votes, Douglas 107,150 and Tinsell 79,249.
