INJUNCTION WAS READY IN PRIMARY ELECTION

Hobby Committee Enjoined Presiding Judges From Imposing the Test Prescribed by Democratic Executive Committee

Through the instrumentality of a writ of injunction issued late Friday afternoon at the instance of the Nueces County Hobby Club, considerable confusion among the women voting in the primary Saturday was avoided...

The test that the women were to be asked to swear to reads as follows: "STATE OF TEXAS, County of Nueces, I, solemnly swear that I am a bona fide Democrat that I have heretofore affiliated with, voted with, and I voted at all supported and have BEEN RECOGNIZED AS A MEMBER OF THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY..."

Mr. Stoyton, chairman of the Nueces County Hobby Club, said that the test proposed was unreasonably prejudicial and inconsistent with the primary law insofar as the same applied to women who desire to vote for the first time in any Texas election...

I swear that I am a Democrat, that I will support all the nominees of this party, and I further swear that in the last general election I voted for all the nominees of the Democratic party, if I voted at all, from constitution to president, both inclusive...

Mr. Stoyton immediately began preparing for a legal fight to prevent the Nueces County Committee from imposing the test that the committee was seeking to apply towards women voters...

At daylight Saturday morning Messrs. Stoyton, Russell and Rex Miller had placed the papers in the hands of the officers, the writ having been received the previous afternoon, and by the time the polls had opened, the papers had been served on each of the twenty-one presiding judges of the election...

ELECTION JUDGES GIVE TO RED CROSS CHAPTER

To the election officers who served at the primary election last Saturday, Mr. Bentley, chairman of the Nueces County Red Cross Chapter, has sent out the following statement...

I have learned that you are appointed as election officers for your precinct to hold the primary election. The candidates who are offering to serve you and asking your consideration at the polls are paying all expenses of these primaries, and you are rendering one day's service in helping to hold them...

If you are willing to contribute the fee for one day's service to the cause? If so, upon receipt of check from the Executive Committee, endorse it "Pay to Nueces County Chapter Red Cross" and mail it to me as president of the association in this county...
