THIRTY NUECES COUNTY YOUNG MEN REGISTER FOR ARMY SERVICE

Thirty young men who have, since June 25, 1918, become 21 years of age, registered yesterday with the local draft board.

Four of these young men are in the United States army and will leave here between September 1st and 4th for camp Bowie as will the 29 who were admitted for general military service.

NUECES COUNTY IN SATURDAY ELECTION CASTS A LIGHT VOTE.

FEW OF THE VOTING PRECINCTS OUTSIDE OF CORPUS CHRISTI WERE OPEN FOR THE RUN-OFF PRIMARY

Corpus Christi and Terrell Are Given Clear Majorities in Corpus Christi While Johnson Receives Five Votes More Than Davidson

The run-off primary election held Saturday afternoon, August 24, 1918, created only a ripple of attention, reports to The Caller last night showing that less than 200 out of 2,500 qualified Democrats of Nueces County took the trouble to register their choice for lieutenant-governor, comptroller and attorney-general.

In last few of the precincts outside of Corpus Christi were elections held. In Corpus Christi all six boxes were open the total vote cast being 131.

Though T. W. Davidson had announced his withdrawal from the race of lieutenant-governor, he polled 45 votes in Corpus Christi as against for W. A. Johnson.

Terrell for comptroller and Corbett for attorney-general had the majorities.

"Owing to the method of distribution it will be necessary for those desiring a tractor to place their orders within the next few weeks. Deliveries for 1918-1919 will be made only during the months from October until February," stated Major Johns.

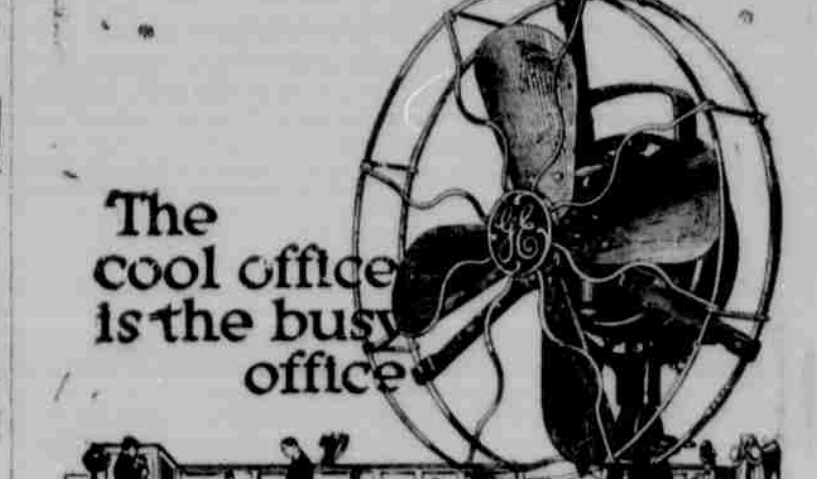
