CRIPPLED SOLDIERS TO BE GIVEN PREFERENCE IN WORK AFTER THE WAR. NEW YORK, Aug. 31.—To use soldier cripples in preference to anyone else, wherever possible after the war, will be one of the plans discussed at the War Work Meeting of the American Institute of Mining Engineers, which opens in Colorado on September 1 and continues for six days.

Mining engineers are taking a special interest in the problem of the employment of cripples after the war, and each of the fifteen sections of the national institute is undertaking individual work tending to prevent the crippled soldier from being a charge on the public—at least so far as the mining industry is concerned.

The work is being done in direct cooperation with the Government through some of the hundreds of American Institute members connected with the war work departments at Washington, D. C.
