### HUNS MUST WITHDRAW FORCES THROUGH A 70 MILE GAP

WITH THE AMERICAN ARMY ON THE SEDAN FRONT, NOVEMBER 6.—American troops at 5:00 o'clock this afternoon are fighting within sight of Sedan, famous for the great battle fought in the Franco-Prussian war in 1870.

The Americans are in the hills in the region of Chemery and Mazonville, the Yanks advancing despite stubborn German resistance. The buildings of Sedan are within plain view, being but six miles away.

This marks an American advance of 27 miles in this region since September 24, every foot of which has been gained by defeating the desperately resisting army. The only solid defense line now left to the Germans is the Rhine, to reach which they must withdraw their enormous fighting forces through a seventy mile gap in Belgium if they are to escape capture.
