PRIVATE BART C. DE WITT WRITES OF EXPERIENCES "IN FRONT OF THE FRONT"

Corpus Christi With 90th Division Has His Max Kit Shot Off His Back By a German Sniper But He Later Got 'em With the Gun

Private Bart DeWitt, a Corpus Christian, with the 90th Division, under the date of October 17th, writes that he has secured a German letter, that is of no further use to the German soldier, who formerly wore it.

"Well, how is the old side kick tonight? I would give enough time notes to paper the kitchen wall, to walk in on you for a good deal. I have seen some pretty nice fighting since my last letter to you. I have been out the top, machine gun nests, H. B. gas and all of those bally things, don't know. You should have been there really.

"I will have a lot to tell you when I do get home. I'm ready to go long if it will be. I'm really homesick tonight. I have not had any mail for nearly a month. I suppose the war is going as you would expect for you and Eddie Allen. If not please let me know as soon as possible.

"I hope that Corpus Christi without doubt will go over the top for the Liberty Loan.

"I believe that I have written to you that I am in the intelligence section which is merely another name for the scouts and snipers. Most of our work is beyond the wire 'in front of the front' as our lieutenant says, and I must pause to confess that more than I can tell you I have been in the trenches since then I am tonight. I am like one of the boys over here who said that he always wanted to cross the ocean and that, by god, he still wanted to.

"One day quite awhile before we had gone over the first time myself and a gas from New Jersey kept spending the day in a shell hole being more of a recreation work. We were quite safe from shell fire because most of the shells went over our heads, but once in a while one would fall short, so you may guess that neither of us were pleased to see the job.

"Finally my company pulled that old one about not liking army life because it was too dangerous and about that time I had one landed a few feet from us and nearly covered us with rocks and mud. I said neither did I like it and I did not mean to do it.

"I was real sore having ditched me of course but I had to be happy and as it was my first through on that for I thought that night would never come so that we could crawl back.

"I have certainly learned to 'get down' quickly and I know that I can get those founders in Corpus Christi for them. That question can only be answered in one way and that is by every man, woman and child giving as much as their individual circumstances will permit. However, only one teaspoon of sugar will be allowed for each cup of coffee or tea. An additional teaspoonful will be allowed for cereal or fruit.
