### NUECES COUNTY GINNING NOW TOTAL 39,276 BALES

Report of Department of Commerce Shows Great Production of South Texas Counties.

Cotton ginnings from the 1918 crop for Nueces County amounted to 39,276 bales up to January 9, 1918, compared with 41,111 bales ginned at a similar period one year ago, according to the latest official report of the Bureau of Commerce, Department of Commerce, just made public.

This report will again call to the attention of the State the rapid growth of cotton raising in the coast section. Nueces County, that ten years ago produced only a comparatively few bales of cotton each season, this year stands fourteenth among Texas cotton producing counties, being exceeded in production only by Collin, Dallas, DeWitt, Ellis, Fort Bend, Grayson, Hill, Hunt, Kaufman, Lamar, McLennan, Midland, Navarro, Wharton and Williamson Counties.
