### They Want A Bridge

Gonzales was the Mecca of bridge contractors Wednesday. Quite a number of them were in the city the occasion being the likelihood of an order by the county commissioners authorizing the building of a bridge over the Guadalupe river near Dryer.

The petition carrying the signatures of one hundred and twenty citizens and tax payers of the Dryer section living on both sides of river, was presented to the court Wednesday and was considered. The petition was in charge of Messrs. Sere and L. D. Dubose; Emkens, Neighbors, J. Boothe, T. Holley and others.

The petition requests that the bridge be erected at a point near Dryer and within convenient distance of a spot where it is thought the depot on the proposed railroad will be located. The bridge, if erected, is estimated to cost in the neighborhood of \$8000.—Gonzales Inquirer.
