### Death of Ex-Governor Hubbard

Ex-Governor Richard B. Hubbard died at his home in Tyler, Texas, after an illness of one month, aged 67 years. In the death of R. B. Hubbard, the state has lost one of its foremost men and democracy its ablest exponent. Born in Georgia he came to Texas in 1852 and has ever since guarded the interests of his adopted state. At the breaking out of the civil war he early cast his fortunes with the confederacy, raised a regiment and commanded it until the close of the war. During the troublesome days of reconstruction he was ever to be found in the front ranks battling for the rights of the people. He was on the ticket with Governor Coke when that brave and fearless leader marched up to the state house at Austin, kicked open the door and took possession and rescued the state from the last vestige of carpet bag rule. All honor to the memory of Richard B. Hubbard; would there were more men like him in the democratic councils of today.
