A Tramp in Clover.

Sacramento, Cal, Feb 13.—John
P. Harmens, a tramp 50 years old,
who by his own confession recover-
ed over \$20,000 that was hidden
by the train robbers a year ago, is
in jail here. For months he has
been living here on the fat of the
land from the proceeds of money
taken from the Overland Express
near Sacramento by Jack Brady
and Browning over a year ago.
The prisoner has turned over
police \$2000 which he had in
German Savings bank, together
with \$5000 in securities, a diamond
ring and a diamond collar button.
Harmens found the money hidden
under a clump of bushes near Sac-
ramento, where the robbers who
held up the train had buried it. It
is known that the robbers obtained
over \$50,000 from the Wells-Fargo
company, but Harmens didn't find
all of the plunder. Harmens in ap-
pearance is a typical tramp. Among
his friends he is known as "Dutch
Charley." After he found the mon-
ey he loaned some of it to responsi-
ble business men and lived a life of
luxury seldom ever dreamed of by
the average tramp.

News was received here yesterday
of the killing of Tuck Hoover by
James Coleman, which took place
yesterday morning in Neal's gro-
cery store at Alleyton, a village
three miles from Columbus.

It seems that Hoover was stand-
ing inside of the store when Cole-
man entered through a side door
and commenced shooting at Hoover.
Two of the shots took effect and
Hoover fell to the ground and died
in a few minutes. Coleman was ar-
rested by Constable Otis Finney
and taken to Columbus, where he
was placed in jail.

The trouble grew out of a diffi-
culty between Hoover and Jake
Burttschel at the same place about
two years ago, in which Hoover
killed Burttschel and for which an
indictment is still pending against
him. Coleman was a brother-in-
law of Burttschel and a bitter feeling
has existed between the parties
since Burttschel was killed. The
deceased was a single man about 30
years of age.

Among those attending the regu-
lar session of justice court here last
Monday, were Attorneys Leonard
and Gray of Yoakum. Mr Gray
informed us that he would open up
a law office here this week, prob-
ably in the Escherr's office build-
ing. Mr Gray has been practicing
law for two years at Dublin, this
state. He created a very favorable
impression while here.
