A Beautiful Residence.

Through the courtesy of Fore-
man F. V. Behrens, we were shown
through the residence of J. A. Wol-
ters Tuesday. When completed
this building will probably be the
most beautiful residence in Shiner.
A small army of carpenters and
painters are at work on the house
this week, and Mr Behrens inform-
us that it would be ready for oc-
cupancy in about ten days or two
weeks. The first story consists of
a parlor, reception room, dining
room, kitchen, etc. The reception
room will be completed entirely
with panel work and will be very
beautiful. There will be two gal-
leries down stairs and one balcony
in the second story. Dormer win-
dows adorn the roof on three sides.
A system of waterworks have been
put in for the bathroom up stairs
and the kitchen. The building re-
flects credit on the contractors,
Mouer & Wealing.
