HALLETTSVILLE.

Judge Spooner and District At-
torney Green came here last Fri-
day to hear the John Price case
on a writ of habeas corpus. After
hearing the testimony Judge
Spooner remanded the defendant
to jail without bail. Price's at-
torneys gave notice of appeal. Your
correspondent has heard many pre-
dict that Price, under the testimony
will never be convicted.

On Saturday the populists held
a county convention in the court
house. B. P. Gandy, N. Avant and
Ben Bailey (colored) were selected
as delegates to the state convention
and instructed to vote for the nom-
ination of Nugent for governor.
Delegates to other conventions were
selected, but given no instructions.
It was determined to make nomi-
nations for county offices and the
chairman was authorized to appoint
a committee of eight, consisting of
one from each Justice's precinct,
which committee is to submit names
of suitable men who will accept
nominations for the various county
offices to a convention of July 11th
when nominations will be made.
It is rumored that B. P. Gandy
will be their nominee for repre-
sentative.
