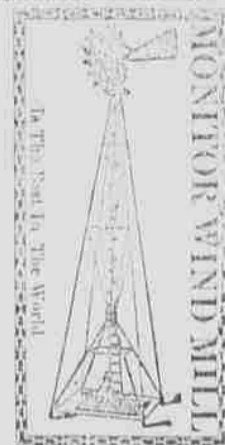

places around here now.

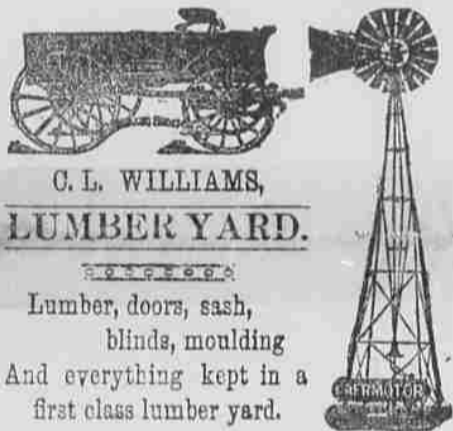
There was a dance at the resi-
