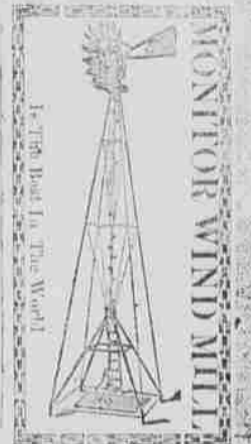

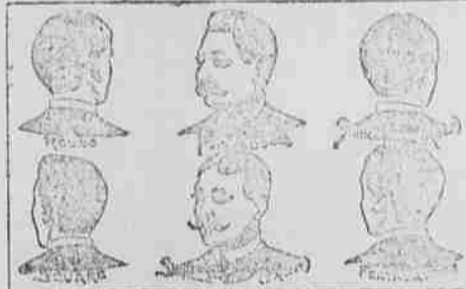

by Dr. Lancaster.

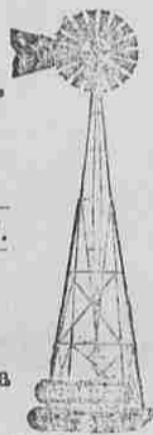
Buescher Sons bought Arnim's
