wife and several children.

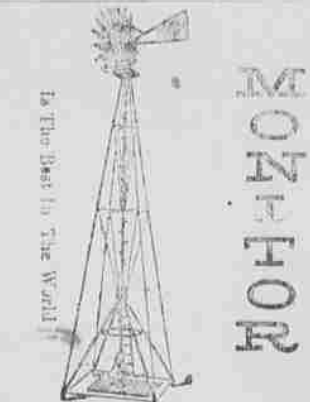
Babe Crane, son of Berry Crane,
