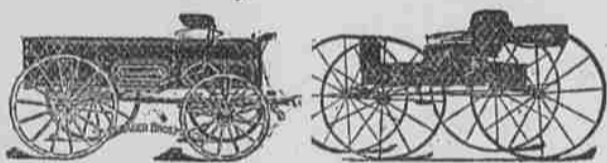

### SUNDAY'S CELEBRATION.

Vitez Loge, No. 195, C. S. P. S.

The C. S. P. S. celebration Sunday was well attended and passed off quietly, without a disturbance. Judge Haidusek arrived Saturday and stopped with Ignaz Baxa. The parade formed at the firemen's engine house early Sunday morning. The procession was headed by the Rothbour-Tomasko band. The C. S. P. S. formed in 34 strong and were followed by the Hermann Soebne Loge. Last came the firemen 17 strong. The parade marched up Main street to the grounds direct, as the heat was too great to permit of marching around town. The fire-boys all carried umbrellas and kept cool. Christian Wagener's place in the ranks was vacant, as Christian is still confined to his bed with the fever. Joe Ondrej, J. F. Kopecky and A. Hummel were with the C. S. P. S., and there were

but two absentees from the company without permission. A pretty good showing for a hot morning. Albert Moeller says he won't carry the flag any more if he knows it, as it is harder work than stocking 20,000 feet of lumber.

On arrival at the grounds the different orders draw up on the platform and Mr. J. F. Kopecky stepped to the front and made a short but exceedingly good address of welcome which was loudly applauded. Mr Kopecky then said "We will now have an address by Mr Frank Ermis, and as it will be in the Bohemian language all those who can't understand are excusable and may do what they like," whereupon there was a stampede to wash the dust out of their throats and partake of some of the good things provided by Messrs M. Richter and Ehlinger.

Mr. Ermis was followed by Judge Haidusek, who delivered the address of the day. Addresses were

also delivered by two young ladies, Miss Anna Hroek and Miss Frances Malina.

Among the visitors from a distant we noticed our old friend Mr Jacob Kure of Moulton.

The celebration wound up with a grand ball at night. The day throughout was intensely hot. In the afternoon there were local showers on all sides of Shiner, but no rain fell near town.

### HALLETTSVILLE.

Tom Williams, arrested on a charge of burning the crib of Lucy Williams and destroying one bale of cotton and 150 bushels of corn, has been remanded to jail in default of a \$400 bond.

The commissioners' court, after a session of 15 days, has completed the task of passing on the assessors rolls and same are now ready for the collector. While doing this work they became frightened at the cracking of the wall in the court house and contracted to have the walls fixed.

Wm Euel, who was some time since declared a lunatic and ordered restrained, was about to die in the county jail, and as the asylums would not take him, declaring there was no room, he has been taken in charge of by A. J. Moore, who cares for him for \$1.00 day at the poor farm.

The public school is open and has a full attendance. The Sacred Heart academy and convent has also a fine attendance, while the attendance at the kindergarten school indicates that Hallettsville needs more school houses.

Prof. Fred Ferguson, a dancing master, was arrested in Corpus Christi last Thursday for the robbery of Palmer's drug store in Yoakum several weeks ago. He was brought back and lodged in jail. The Graphic says:

"In conversation with Mr Palmer this morning, relative to the arrest of young Fred Ferguson, he said that he found a goodly number of his goods in the boy's trunk at Corpus Christi; that some of them had been sold to a druggist down there, but the majority of them, including the spectacles, etc., he has not yet found, but thinks he will yet get them. Fred claims that his uncle sent him the goods, and that Mr. Palmer is mistaken about his stealing them. A lot of D. B. Cain's goods were also found in the trunk along with Mr. Palmer's goods, and yesterday Mr. Cain, accompanied by City Marshal Crossell, went to Corpus Christi, identified the goods, consisting of some pocket knives, tobacco, etc., and brought them back. They also found by another search of the house where Ferguson resided, a lot of the spectacles taken from Mr. Palmer. Fred is in jail at Guero."
