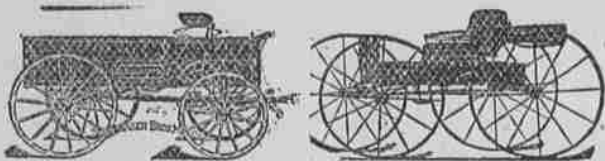

## HALLETTSVILLE.

Hallettsville, Nov. 9.—A slow rain has been falling here for 24 hours. It is putting a good season in the ground and doing no harm to the farmers, who, as a general thing, are through gathering their crops and many of whom have already cut the stalks and plowed them under. Cold, but too wet for hog killing.

Cattle buyers are plentiful and prices are fairly good. Austin parties bought a lot of four-year-old heaves here last week and drove them to Austin, where they will be fed. A number of cows and mixed

cattle were also bought and driven off. Parties here who are feeding will begin to ship out a few the latter part of this month.

There is now considerable discussion here about abolishing the office of city marshal. The office of assessor and collector some years ago was abolished and the duties of that office conferred upon the marshal. It is now proposed to have an assessor and collector and dispense with the services of a marshal. The question will be settled at the next council meeting.
