William Showell Gets There—The Old Engine Given to the Veteran Firemen—Petitions and Reports.

The city council met at 8 o'clock last evening, Mayor Scott presiding, Recorder Hyams was absent and his place was filled by Assistant Recorder W. W. Madison.

J. H. Tolle and others residing in North Salt Lake represented that cattle were running at large in that portion of the city and doing considerable damage, and they asked that an ordinance be established in North Salt Lake.

T. W. Jennings and others represented that water from the Eleventh West street canal was flowing onto the land in the vicinity of the canal, and that some twenty acres were already under water.

The property owners of Commercial street represented that they were unable to cut their street at their own expense, and asked that Salt Lake sidewalks be put in on First and Second streets.

W. Hubbard and others residing on the north bench asked that a ditch be constructed from the present terminus of Red Butte ditch, it was not the intention to complete the canal at present.

The plumbers union presented a protest against the appointment of Edward Rush as inspector of plumbing.

William Showell asked that he be appointed city assessor.

Susan A. Strickland asked for the remission of dog tax for one year.

Fred Trimmer and other persons owning property on Capitol hill represented that the city council and the Capital ground commission entered into an agreement to run a pipe from City creek to the Capitol grounds.

John C. Cutler asked permission to lay a private pipe from the terrace of his house to his residence on West Temple street.

William Langdon and others asked for an extension of the main along North Temple street.

Dillon & Co. requested that they be purchased the Arcade restaurant and asked that Mr. Hallahan be transferred to them.
