Judge James A. Miner disposed of the following cases in the judicial sanctum yesterday:

Craig vs. Lutz; on motion of A. R. Heywood and by consent of H. W. Smith, the sale was postponed for one week.

The People vs. Peter Kendrick and William Williamson; Peter Kendrick arraigned, withdrawn plea of not guilty and pleaded guilty to petit larceny; sentenced to five months in the county jail.

The grand jury came into court and presented two indictments against territorial laws, and two against territorial laws ignored.

The People vs. Ed Fay; arraigned, pleaded guilty, and sentenced to two years in the penitentiary.

The People vs. J. McLaughlin et al.; defendant sustained; on motion of David Evans, an order was granted that the case be submitted to the grand jury.

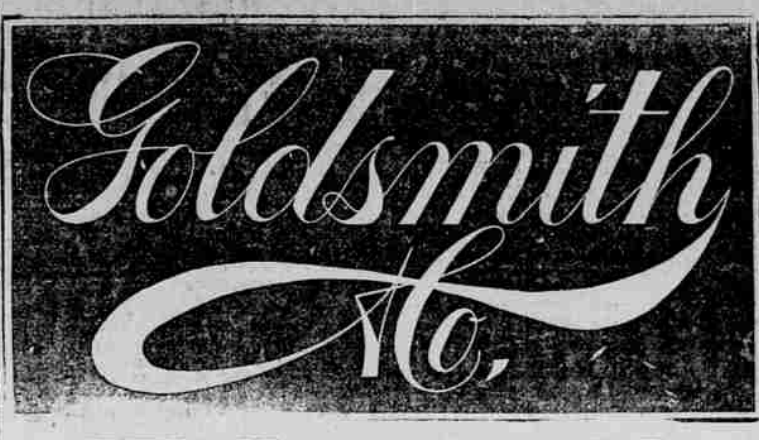
