SPAIN WILL NOT ACCEPT VERDICT

Should Maine Report Include Spanish Responsibility.

COMBINED EUROPE WILL BE INVOKED

To Intervene On the Plea of Equity and Common Fairness.

Hoped That the United States Will Agree to the Appointment of a Neutral Court of Naval Constructors Who Will Carry Out Their Work in an Unbiased Manner—Spaniards Greatly Affronted By Washington Reports—War News.

New York, March 22.—I am in a position to inform you—and it is highly important just now, in connection with the political situations of the immediate future—that the Spanish government will refuse to accept any finding of the Maine commission which may suggest Spanish responsibility, says the Madrid correspondent of the Herald.

It is hoped that under such circumstances the United States will agree to the appointment of a neutral court of naval constructors, who could carry out their work with perfectly unbiased minds, a condition almost impossible to officers of the United States, who would naturally seek to exonerate their service from all fault or blame, and who would look upon Spain as an enemy.

SPAIN'S FLYING SQUADRON

Reasons For Its Detention at the Canary Islands.

New York, March 22.—A dispatch to the World from Madrid says: The Madrid papers, including the ministerial organs, the Correos, the Liberales and the Glorioso, print by permission these items of news regarding naval preparations.

Washington, March 22.—The cabinet meeting today lasted something over an hour and was devoted exclusively to the Spanish situation in general, and to the forthcoming report of the Maine court of inquiry. The tone of the discussion was very firm and determined that there must come an end to the present state of affairs in Cuba.

Other cabinet officers state that the general plan included the sending of a presidential message along with the report, stating that the president would call upon to make suitable response to the case presented by the court of inquiry.
