OFFICIAL CANVAS IN UTAH OVER WITH

VOTE GIVEN IN DETAIL IN TABULATED FORM.

Judge Albert H. Christensen Defeats Former Judge Erickson By About Seven Hundred and Fifty Votes in Seventh Judicial District—About the Same For Cherry Over Hoffmann.

After several days of strenuous labor the state canvassing board on Wednesday of last week completed the official scrutiny of the recent election returns in Utah. The figures arrived at do not differ materially from those already published. M. H. Walker, presidential elector on the republican ticket, was accorded the honor of polling the largest vote of electors, his total being 42,100. John N. Davis was second with 42,067 and Margaret Zane Wither polled 42,013 and E. Homer, 41,919. Other electoral votes were:

work well on the whole and the canvassing board was not put to any considerable trouble. One feature of the election reports is amusing though it might easily have been serious under different conditions. The clerk of Beaver county neglected to record the vote for Willis Johnson, democratic candidate for the senate.

He likewise forgot the totals for H. N. Hayes, democratic candidate for judge of the Sixth Judicial district. The omission did not change the result in any manner fortunately. Had the result been close, however, a pretty dispute would have arisen.

Vote On Amendments.

The returns on the proposed amendments to the state constitution show that with the exception of the third and fourth amendments the ayes did not total ten thousand. The official figures are:

The official canvass resulted in but trifling changes from the announced vote on the election of state senators. The house of representatives and the senate is safely republican. In the Seventh Judicial district Christensen's vote is 5005, Erickson, 4259; Christensen's plurality, 746 votes. J. W. Cherry, district attorney, defeats Hoffmann by about the same plurality.

PROVO IS GETTING BUSY

Will Raise Fifty Thousand Dollars For the Utah Coal Road.

In accordance with the resolution passed at the mass meeting held at Provo one evening last week Mayor Charles F. Decker has appointed several well known men as a committee to raise the fifty thousand dollars necessary to purchase the right of way from Spanish Fork Canyon to Provo and terminal grounds in that city for the Utah Coal Railway company.

The committee consists of J. William Knight, Webster Hoover, W. H. Ray, Arthur N. Taylor, E. T. Harding, Joseph T. Farror, W. B. Brereton, Willis K. Spafford, T. P. Pierpont, John C. Deal, William K. Farrer and David H. Bebe.

Issue Terminal Statement.

PROVO, Nov. 28.—The committee appointed by Mayor Decker to raise the fifty thousand dollars necessary to secure the right of way and terminal for the Utah Coal railroad, which is being built from the coal beds in Carbon county to connect with the Salt Lake Route in this county, met yesterday and issued a statement to the public. It calls on all citizens of Provo to work for the road and assist in a financial manner.

TRAIN OF MYSTERY

Millionaire Special, Scheduled Locally, Passes Ity.

By a change in schedule the "train of mystery," carrying twenty-five millionaires from the East to the Pacific Coast, missed Salt Lake City. The train is called the "Eladori" and was chartered by the wealthy passengers for thirty thousand dollars. Among those on board is one of the governors of the Bank of France. Due at Denver, Colo., November 18th by the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy, it was supposed to have remained there a week and then go west to Salt Lake City by the Denver and Rio Grande, leaving Zion for San Francisco by the Western Pacific. Instead, it changed its schedule for some unknown reason and a dispatch received at Denver states that the train is now en route over the Southern Pacific for Los Angeles where it was due December 2d. Its exact location is unknown.
