From the Land of Christ.

A missionary from Babylonia was in town Friday soliciting subscriptions for an orphan's home at Ninivah. The institution is conducted entirely by himself and one or two members of his family. They take care of a hundred and twenty-five children all of whom he states sleep on the floor in one room. He is now seeking to raise \$1,500 with which to erect another story, which he believes will prove more healthy and sanitary. Last year a child's disease killed twenty-five of his wards.

This man from the country where Jesus Christ was born is of the Chaldean faith and he says he speaks and writes the same language that Christ did. The Chaldeans on account of being Christians are persecuted by the Moslem Turk and it was only three years ago that Ninivah was attacked and several thousand men, women and children massacred. The missionary says his father, brothers and many other relatives were killed by the Turks, and he himself is scarred from head to foot, the result of wounds received at that time.

So bitter is the feeling against the Christians that they live in fear all the time of an attack by the Moslems. Thus in the past few years the Chaldeans have not only been looted by the foes of Turkey as a nation but internal troubles have done more to thin their ranks than the outside enemy.

According to the missionary the high cost of living is reduced to a minimum in Babylonia. He is the possessor of a small tract which has been in the family for generations. This tract supports his entire orphan home. Sheep furnish the wool for the clothing and the grapes are ground by a water wheel. The institution is entirely self-supporting.
