MODENA DAIRY CATTLE THREATENED BY RABIES

Cattle belonging to the dairy herd of Max Battley at Modena have recently been dying at the rate of about one a three days, and Dr. H. W. Hogan, state live stock inspector, went there Monday to see what was the matter.

On September 10th Mrs. Battley discovered a coyote in the yard killing a pig. A call for assistance brought a neighbor, James Moore, who shot the animal. About ten days afterward a pig died and other cattle of the herd have been dying at the rate of about one in three days since that time.

LIVE STOCK PRICES GO UP MORE THAN HALF IN YEAR

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 28.—Prices received by producers for cattle, sheep and hogs have gained 52.7 per cent in the general average from 1916 to 1917. Latest reports compiled by the department of agriculture show these advances.

Live cattle, per 100 pounds, live weight, from \$4.55 to \$8.49; veal calves, from \$8.77 to \$11.98; sheep, from \$5.25 to \$10.65; lambs, from \$3.22 to \$12.96; hogs, from \$9.22 to \$15.55; chickens, from 14.5 to \$1.00 a pound.
