In the suburbs of great cities an industry has sprung up, having for its object the recovery of tin solvent used in mining and smelting tin ores.

OLD TIN CANS

The space between the dock platform and the dock is filled with tin cans, and the interior converted into a miserable habitation by the tinners, men and women, who thus herd together their supplies being drawn from the dump.

These dumping docks are the principal source of supply for the industry, and a wagon load of tin cans can be bought at such places for four or five cents.

The process is an old one, but into which a few acids are thrown, the cans are then filled with water, a quart of benzene poured over them and agitated.
