The Supreme Court Finally Disposes of the Chinese Case.

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 10.—The mandate of the Supreme Court of the United States to the circuit court for the southern district of New York, affirming the decision of that court on the exclusion case, was transmitted yesterday.
