COUNTY EXPENDS \$2360 ON POOR

Average of \$25 Per Quarter Required for Inmates at the County Infirmary

At the meeting of the Weber county commissioners yesterday afternoon, Commissioner D. H. Ensign submitted the report on "poor aid" for the quarter ending March 31. During the period thirty-one persons were cared for in the county infirmary for a total of 2412 days at a cost of \$2360.42. An average cost of \$25.44 per inmate. One inmate died during the quarter and six received treatment at the hospital at a cost of \$367.
