UTAH-IDAHO CO. REPORT IS FILED

Year's Operations Revealed to Stockholders; Love Succeeds Romney

SALT LAKE, May 11.—Full report of the operations of the Utah-Idaho Sugar company was submitted yesterday to the stockholders of the company for the fiscal year ending February 29. After receiving the report which was submitted by Heber J. Grant, president of the company, the stockholders re-elected the present board of directors. Stephen H. Love, salesman of the company, was elected to succeed the late George Romney.

The report, in substance, follows: It is a matter of congratulation that while the year just past was of the most trying of any in our experience, we were enabled to meet its many trying problems in a manner satisfactory to our stockholders.

Our company has maintained its practice of years past, to hold its home territory a sufficient supply of sugar to take care of the reasonable needs of consumers, curbing speculation as far as possible. Thus, while there has been a shortage of sugar in all parts of the world in late months, and in many sections in the west, and in many sections in the north, the region supplied by our company has never been without a reasonable amount of sugar, and unless something unforeseen arises the necessities of our patrons in our territory will be protected in their supply of sugar until a new supply is assured.

From the figures to be submitted by the secretary and treasurer, it will be seen that our fixed and permanent assets now stand at \$23,214,322.13, having increased \$5,015,024.49 since the last statement was issued, this being due to the fact that we have purchased from the Amalgamated Sugar company their plant at Brigham City, which was originally built by this company, also the canal system on the east side of the Bear river, known as the Hammond canal, and the completed factory at Whitehall, Mont., which is now being dismantled and moved to the Bear river valley. We have also purchased a 500-ton plant at Delta, Utah, besides purchasing considerable tracts of land in Utah, Idaho and Washington, which we devoted to beet culture, as much as possible of the coming season.

Working Capital. In view of the large amount which will be required to pay for beets and operations, and the purchase of lands and plants above referred to, it will no doubt be necessary for us to bring into the business some new working capital, either by the issue of preferred stock, a bond issue or long term notes, and a committee has already been appointed to go into this question.

The total output of sugar last season was 1,329,931 bags, as against 1,636,205 bags for the preceding year. This falling off was due to the unprecedented drought, which so far reduced the beet tonnage as to render it unadvisable to operate the plants at Shelly, Idaho, and Yakima, Wash. The losses caused the farmers by the drought were excessively severe and entailed great hardships upon many of the beet growers. The board of directors, therefore, decided to pay an additional one dollar per ton on the entire crop of beets over and above the price of \$10 per ton, at which price contracts were made. Besides this a substantial appropriation was made to assist those growers who planted beets but whose beetcrops were an entire failure. These additional payments were made to the growers in the stock of the company at par value, or in cash, at their option.

It is worthy of comment that the company now has a total of 5576 stockholders, located in nearly every state in the union. It is especially gratifying that many beet growers are now more stockholders in the company, and our hope is that they will retain their stock and become permanently interested, sharing in any dividends the company may earn and taking their share in the conduct of its affairs. The company will continue to offer facilities to beet growers to acquire still more stock. The same opportunity will be given employees, and it is gratifying to note that many of these are already included in the list of stockholders. The adoption of this plan among the beet growers and employees is a realization of the principle of cooperation, on which the company was originally founded, and is one which we believe will insure justice and fair dealing in its operations.

Insure Employees. A year ago last January the company decided to place insurance on the lives of its yearly employees who had been in continuous service for two years or more, the minimum amount of each policy being \$1000, \$100 to be added each year after the tenth year of continuous service, the company

Chicago Engineers In Light Rate Case

SALT LAKE, May 11.—Figures and testimony showing comparison between steam generating and hydroelectric power plants in general and probable cost of a steam plant at the shores of Utah Lake, consumed most of the time of the public utilities commission yesterday at the hearing on the application of the Utah Power and Light company for an increase in its power rates.

William S. Monroe of Sargent and Lundy, Chicago engineers, was the principal witness of the day. Louis Elliot, steam plant expert of Electric Bond and Share company, was the stand at the close of the day, and his cross-examination will continue today.

MINER KILLED IN PARK CITY BLAST

PARK CITY, May 11.—As the result of a premature blast at the 1200 foot level of the Daily West mine here, Roland C. Livingston, 25 years old, is dead. He was so seriously injured as a result of the blast that he died a few hours later. He was injured about the head and chest.

Mr. Livingston was born in Spring City, Utah, and served in the war. Surviving him are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. T. W. Livingston, Elberta, Utah, and the following brothers and sisters: Edward and Reed Livingston, Elberta; Asa Livingston, Silt Lake; Mrs. Della Cowley, Elberta; Mrs. Bert Albert, Spring City, and Mrs. Irene Dorris, Silt Lake.

The body will be taken to Spring City for funeral services and interment.

NIBLEY HEARING TO BE CONDUCTED MAY 20

SALT LAKE, May 11.—Merrill Nibley will give a preliminary hearing before Justice Van Peck, United States commissioner, at 10 o'clock, May 20. Mr. Nibley is vice president and assistant general manager of the Utah-Idaho Sugar company which is charged with profiting in sugar.

POCATELLO TEACHERS GIVEN HIGHER WAGES

POCATELLO, Ida., May 11.—Salaries for teachers of the Pocatello school system were materially advanced, following a meeting of the Pocatello school board and a special committee of the Rotary club.

Grade teachers will get \$1300 for the first year; for the second \$1400, for the third, \$1500; and for the fourth, \$1600.

High school teachers begin with \$1500 and an increase of \$100 per year up to the fourth year, a maximum of \$1800. Heads of departments in the high school are allowed \$200 more than instructors. Special teachers will receive the same as high school teachers.

DENIES CONTINUANCE OF S. L. BANK CASE

SALT LAKE, May 11.—In the case of the receiver of the Merchants' bank of Salt Lake against thirteen defendants to recover \$800 each, alleged to have been lost to the institution through mismanagement, continuance of the case for a long period of time was denied yesterday by Judge P. C. Evans. The defendants in the action were all at one time or another directors of the bank.

BARBER SERIOUSLY HURT IN ACCIDENT

SALT LAKE, May 11.—John A. Mitchell, 39 years of age, is in a precarious condition as the result of being struck by a taxi last evening at 11:30, as he stepped from the curb to catch a streetcar. Mitchell is a barber employed at 217 South State street. The accident occurred at Ninth South and Ninth East streets.

INCREASE ACREAGE OF SNAKE RIVER PROJECT

SALT LAKE, May 11.—That the irrigable acreage of the Snake river valley will be increased by 750,000 acres by the Snake river reclamation project is the opinion of C. J. Blanchard, chief statistician in charge of publicity and relations of the United States reclamation service, who arrived here yesterday from Paul, Idaho, where he attended a convention of industrial and financial institutions of the Snake river valley.

FLORIDA WATER IS FATAL TO TWO MEN

TWIN FALLS, Ida., May 11.—Earl Anderson of Salt Lake and Ralph Cox of Twin Falls died yesterday from effects of some alcoholic beverage, said to have been Florida water, which they drank. Anderson died within an hour after he was taken to a hospital Monday evening. Cox died yesterday at noon in the same institution.

MAN THROWN FROM AUTO AND KILLED

TWIN FALLS, Ida., May 11.—James Bower, 45, a resident of Twin Falls was instantly killed last night when he was caught under an automobile and catapulted off a canal bridge five miles southeast of here, James Odell, who occupied the back seat with Bower, sustained a fractured jaw and ribs. Mrs. Bower, riding in the front seat with Odell, who was driving, was thrown clear and uninjured. Failure of an attempt to make a turn at the crossing is said to have caused the accident.
