The concert today will mark the initial appearance of the Southern Pacific band in the summer concerts. Arthur L. Agee will act as conductor.

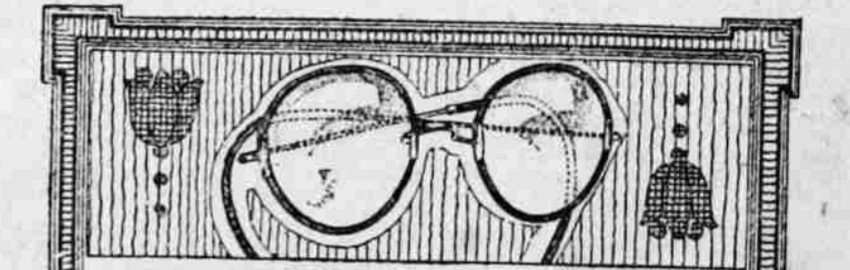

Russian Sunflower Gains as Ensilage

The importance of Russian sunflower as an ensilage food product for cattle is becoming generally known throughout the western states, according to L. F. Kneipp, district forester of the local offices. He states that this cattle food, as an ensilage, has approximately half the food value of alfalfa. Notwithstanding the greater food value of alfalfa, the sunflower is the cheaper feed, a single acre producing nearly 25 tons of food which cattle relish.
