The waterworks department earnestly requests the co-operation of all consumers in a strict observance of the above specified hours, and where only a small lawn is to be watered, expects that only the amount of water necessary be used and not allowed to run the entire time of the sprinkling hours when not necessary for the proper care of the lawn.

Sprinkling without a nozzle or spray is positively prohibited, and water found running through a hose without a nozzle or spray, or running outside the specified hours is subject to turn off without further notice.
