HARTFORD, Conn., June 10.—The stubbornness of Gov. Marcus H. Holcomb in expiating, to every appeal made to him to call a special session of the legislature to ratify the woman suffrage amendment, he replies: "I still do not believe that a special emergency exists."

This answer in the face of the fact that nearly 17,000,000 women will be disfranchised unless one more legislature ratifies the Anthony amendment.

Perhaps Governor Holcomb would agree with anti-suffrage politicians who say "nobody wants equal suffrage except a few childless women." If he was not being pursued by a woman who has five bright little ones, and who knows the need of the ballot in the hands of all the women to protect all their children of the nation.

On Trail of Executive
This woman is Mrs. Thomas N. Hepburn, Connecticut state chairman of the National Woman's Party, who has been hot on the trail of the chief executive for several months.

Mrs. Hepburn has proved to this Republican governor that suffragists do have children, and that the more they have the harder they fight for better government and more freedom. She has kept the governor busy expounding his trail reason for not calling a special session.

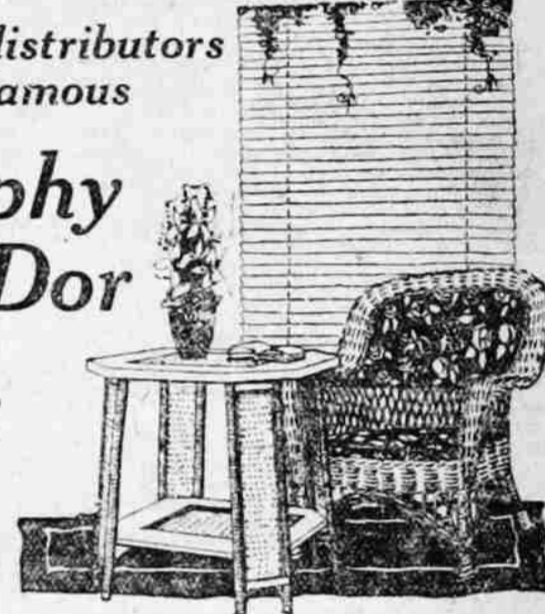
