Murphy won the three-year-old trot against him. Murphy with Brusloff, while the 2:11 trot with 13 in the field was won by Echo Direct.

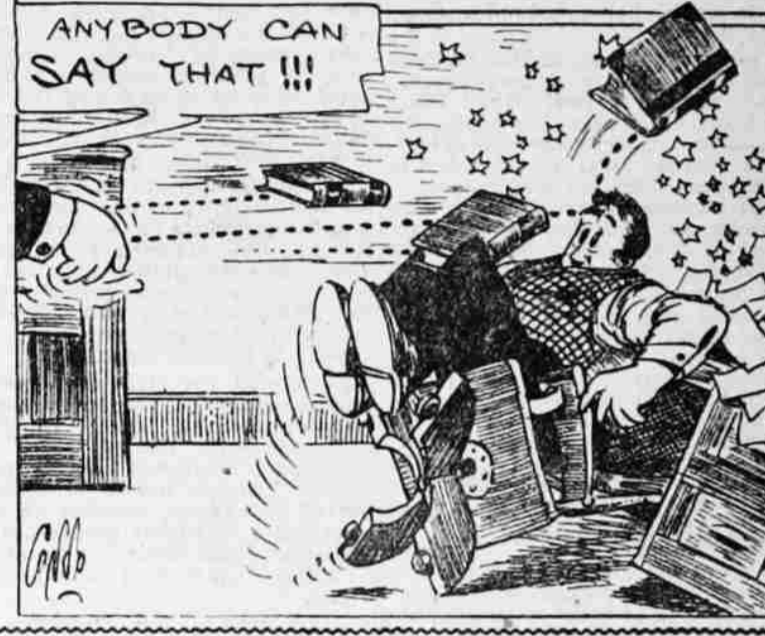

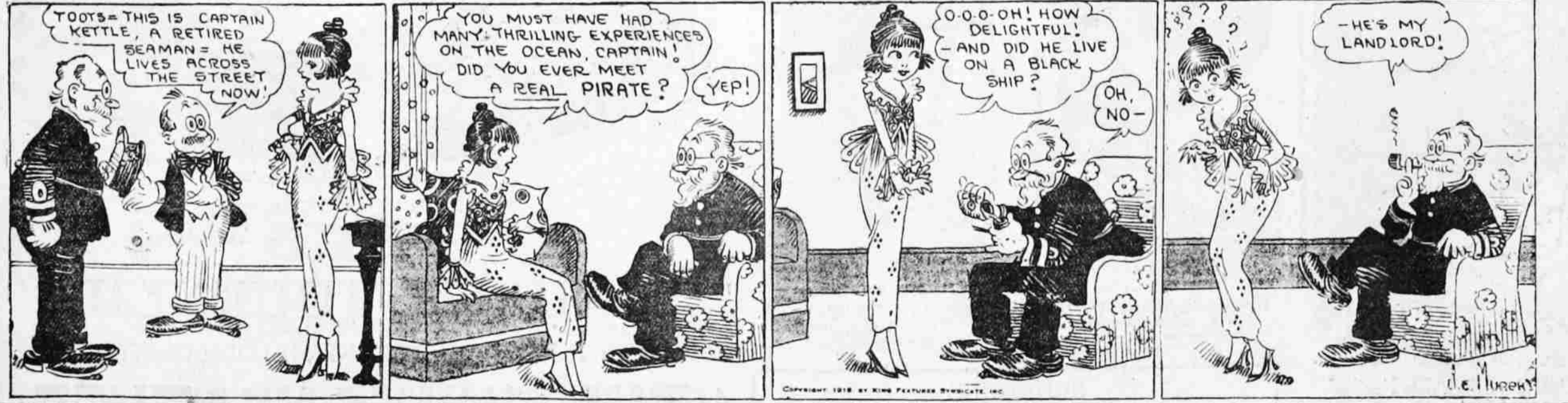
