

# OPENING GAME OF WORLD SERIES TO BE DECIDED

CINCINNATI, O., Sept. 22.—The loss of a coin today at the meeting of the national commission will decide where the opening game of the world's series will be played between the Cincinnati Reds, winners of the National league pennant, and the Chicago White Sox, the likely winners of the American league pennant. Arrangements at the same time will be made for the games between the Cleveland Americans and the Cincinnati club, in the event the White Sox are nosed out by the runner-up.

The first two games will be played in Cincinnati the next three in the American league city winning the pennant of that league, then two in Cincinnati if necessary, followed by one in the American league city. The place for the ninth game, if necessary, is to be decided by lot.

The first game is scheduled for Wednesday, October 1. The umpires who will judge the plays in the world series American league: R. F. Nallin and William J. Evans. National league: Charles Rigler and Emmett Quigley.

The commission was scheduled to meet at noon and in addition to setting the place and dates of the games, was to thrash out other matters relative to the schedule, tickets, umpires and time of starting the contests. October 1 was practically settled upon as the opening date. It was also said that the first two games would be played in the city winning the toss, and the next three games would be played in the city of the other contender. The next two, if necessary, would be played where the series started, and if neither club had yet won its fifth game, the remaining games would be played in the other city.

It was further announced that the drawing for the tickets for the games here would be started by Presidents Heydler and Johnson. They were to draw the first hundred envelopes.

## NEW MERCHANT MARINE POLICY IS ANNOUNCED

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22.—A merchant marine policy contemplating gradual relinquishment to private operation of the larger vessels of the government-built fleet and immediate sale of the smaller vessels, has been formulated by the executive committee of the National Merchant Marine Association. It was announced today by Edward B. Burling, chairman of the committee. Recommendations of the committee, it was said, will be submitted to the association's council of forty-five members for adoption and presentation to congress as a proposed piece in the enactment of legislation.

Believing that the immediate sale of all ships to private operators is "not only undesirable but impractical," the committee recommends that the large steel vessels be sold only as the development of private firms might warrant, with the sale of such ships confined to American firms and made at current world market prices. Immediate disposal of the smaller vessel is recommended, however, without restriction as to purchasers.

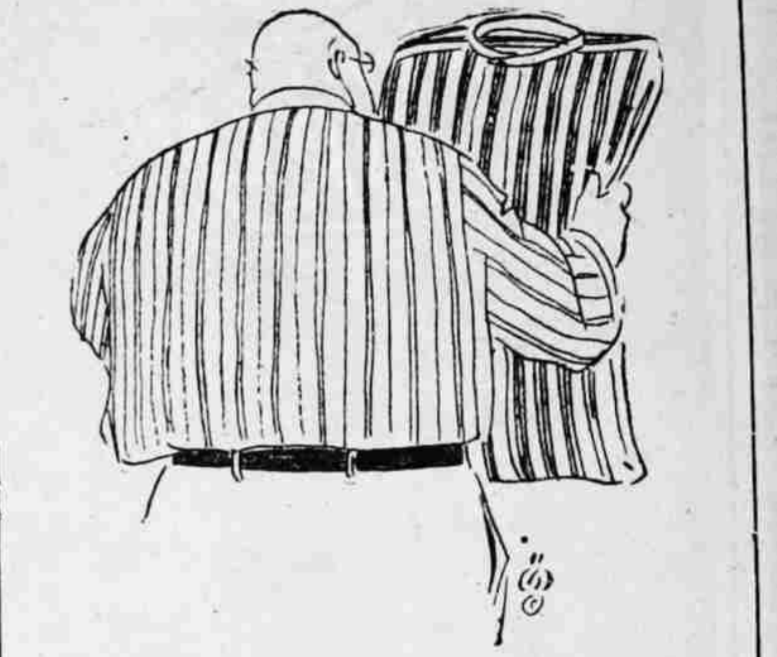
