

Senator Johnson Cheered by Women Of San Francisco

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 2.—United States Senator Hiram W. Johnson at a luncheon here today told more than 1000 of San Francisco's most prominent women that the peace treaty with its Shantung provision is a blot on American honor and that the league of nations as now constituted would make America a party to perpetuating this and other wrongs.

The women were an enthusiastic audience, and time after time they interrupted the speaker with applause and cheers. The audience represented the women leaders in the professional, business and social life of the city.

This was Senator Johnson's third and final speech in San Francisco on his present speaking tour against the treaty and league as now constituted. President Wilson, here two weeks ago, spoke in support of the league. The president spoke also to three audiences in Senator Johnson's home city and at one, to the women of the San Francisco Center. Many of his audience came to hear Senator Johnson today. Both speakers had cordial receptions.

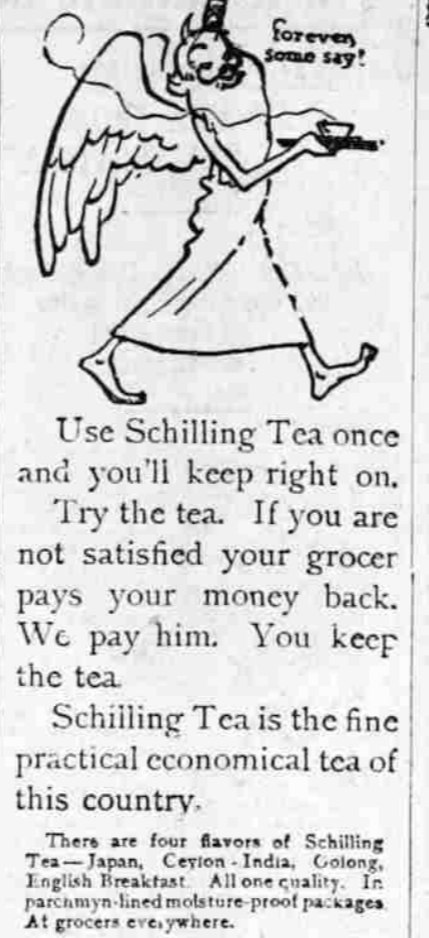

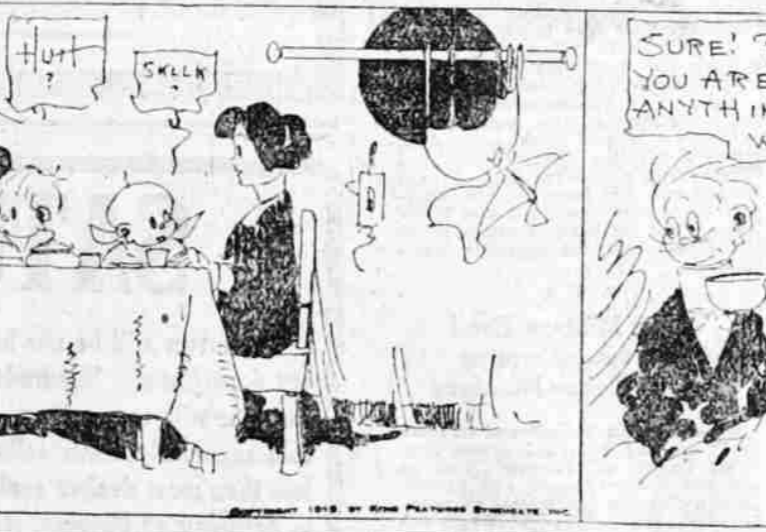

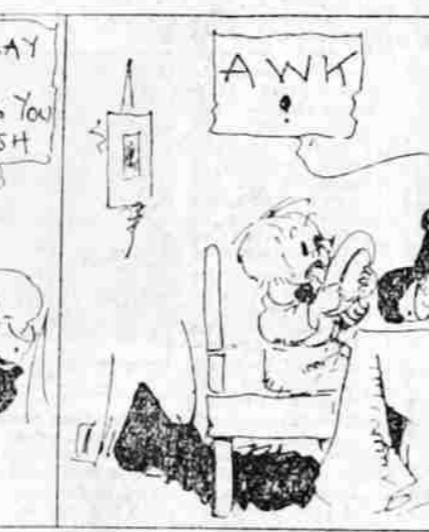
