

Sec. Burlison Gives Account Of Administration

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Oct. 15.—Postmaster General Burlison today gave the National Hardware Association and the American Hardware Manufacturers' Association, in joint session here, the first public account of his administration, which he has made since he entered the cabinet.

Policies which have made him the object of perhaps the most bitter attacks directed against any of President Wilson's advisers, were explained and the difficulties of his administration under war conditions were described to the business men forming the audience.

"Record has been made of what I stand for," Mr. Burlison declared, "smashing his fist into his open palm, and it is not going to be changed."

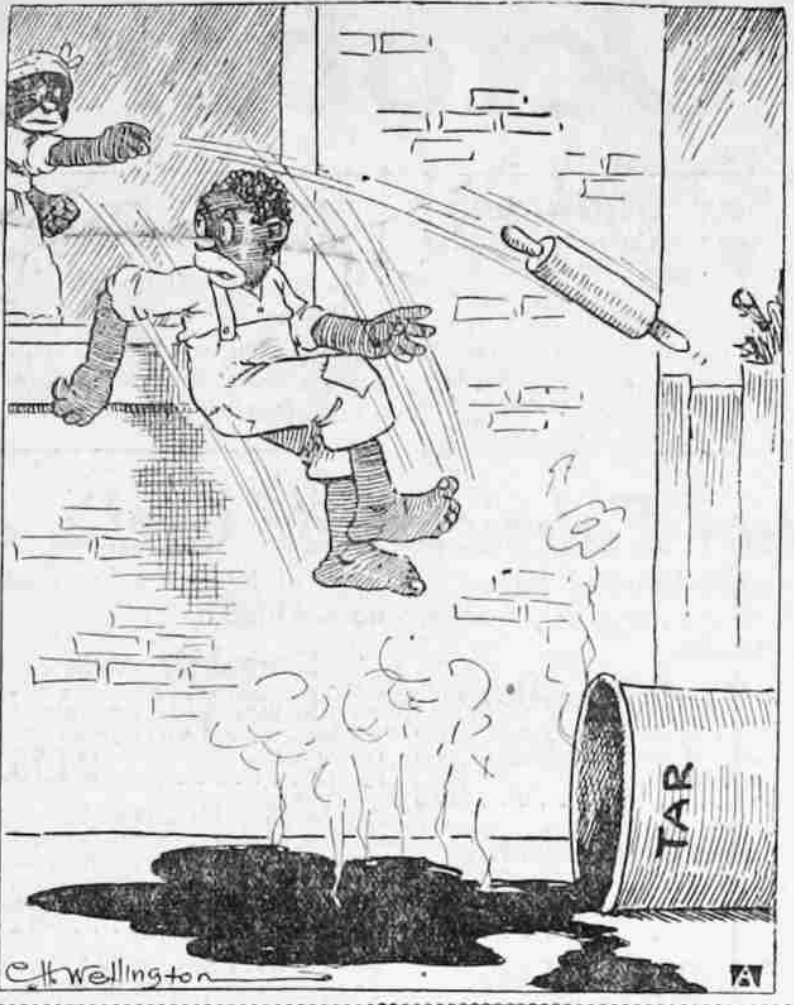
Chief among his critics Mr. Burlison listed the express companies, which, he said, were angered by his development of the parcel post; the railroads, opposed to changing the basis of mail pay from weight to space; owners of pneumatic tube systems, which, he declared, had been nothing short of "retard"; newspapers and magazines, which had been forced to pay higher second class rates; and the American Federation of Labor, offended by his stand against public employees affiliating with an organization using the strike to enforce demands. He declared he had been confronted with powerful opposition exerted through congress by these interests.

Mr. Burlison particularly defended his enforcement of the espionage act which, he said, earned him epithets of the disloyal because he excluded radical newspapers from the mails.

Turning to current political questions, the postmaster general declared the welfare of the country waited on ratification of the peace treaty by congress and the passage of important legislation urged by President Wilson many months ago.

"Now they are talking about a recess in November," he said, "with

150-ton plant, such as is at present being installed, running for several years, in the intervening period of continuous operation more extensive ore bodies have been developed, confirming the statements of J. E. Spitz, in the United States geological survey, bulletin No. 225, to the effect that the deposit is undoubtedly continued upward.

A corporation known as the Silver Peak Chemical company, with offices at 218 State Bank building, Tonopah, has been organized to work the alum deposits.

The method of treating the material is simple, being a process of crushing, water leaching and crystallizing, evaporation being unnecessary, as the material crystallizes with the cooling of the water.

Crystals of pure alum can be obtained in any size, depending on the length of time the material is kept in the water. The company has acquired title to the Minnesota and adjoining springs, and is now installing a pipe line to insure plenty alum property by gravity.

Many prominent business men of Nevada are connected with the new enterprise, and all are sanguine of the success of the industry. The pure potash alum is quoted at from \$150 to \$200 per ton in the chemical trade journals, and because the Silver Peak Chemical company is in a position to produce the pure material by natural means, whereas other producers are required to treat it by an expensive process, it is, according to well informed chemists, in a position to dominate the alum industry of the United States, which has now been protected against foreign competition.

Germans in the Fighting in Russia

BERLIN, Tuesday, Oct. 14.—(By the Associated Press.)—An army officer, formerly on the staff of Gen. von der Goltz who arrived in Berlin from Mitau today, told the Associated Press correspondent that Col. Avaloff-Bermond was not aiming at the capture of Riga but was endeavoring to safeguard the Dvina front in the direction of Moscow. The officer declared that Col. Avaloff-Bermond now controlled the Dvina bridgeheads, which, however, were menaced by the Letts who were approaching from the north.

The officer declared the German soldiers fighting under Avaloff-Bermond's command were determined to remain in the Russian service and fight with the bourgeoisie against the Bolsheviks. He accused the Letts and Estonians of being "simon pure Bolsheviks" and charged that Great Britain was inciting them to action against Avaloff-Bermond. It was his opinion that if Avaloff-Bermond was able to hold the Dvina front and advance eastward it would be a comparatively simple matter to effect a junction with General Denikin.

The officer declared the sentiment of the former German troops who have refused to return home might be expressed thus:

"We are superfluous at home and, therefore, we propose to serve our country under the Russian colors until the Bolshevik menace is overcome."

Avaloff-Bermond apparently is well supplied with war materials, the officer reported. His troops are stationed in the region about Riga and are prepared, in the officer's opinion, to enter Riga should the Letts attempt to take the offensive.

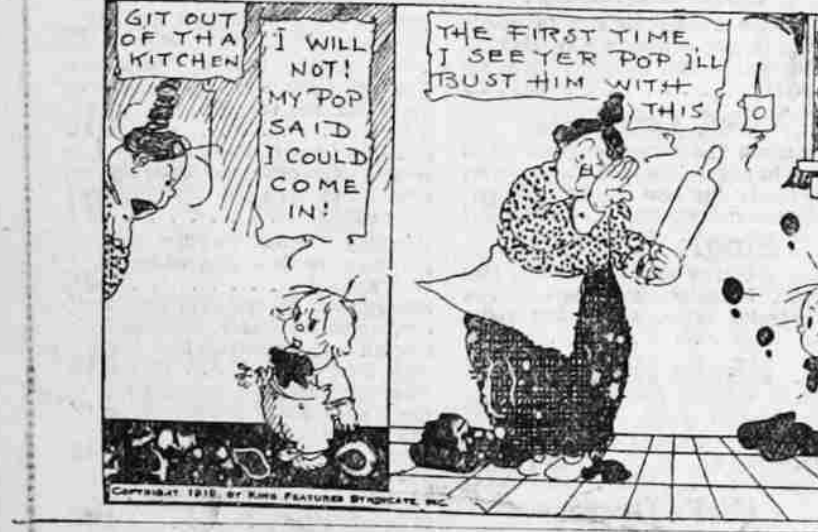
