CITIZENS HOLD NAVY YARD JOBS OVER ALL ALIENS

BOSTON, Oct. 28.—No citizens of the United States are to be removed from their jobs at navy yards because of lack of work or lack of funds for naval construction, until all aliens have been discharged. This is the substance of an order by Secretary Daniels, received at the first naval district headquarters here today.

Five Men Indicted For Plot to Defraud U. S. Government

PHOENIX, Ariz., Oct. 27.—Five men were indicted by the federal grand jury here today, charged with conspiracy to defraud the government in the sale of hay for army use. They are: Alfred J. Peters, wealthy Tampa hay and grain merchant; Vernon Peters, his son; Joseph N. Jagers, former inspector for the Salt River Valley Hay association; Paul R. Seppl and Clifford Smith, former employees of Peters.

The defendants are charged with agreeing to induce the government by false representations to accept and pay for low grades of hay on the basis of higher grades specified in contracts. The conspiracy is alleged to have been in effect from December 1, 1918, to May 13, 1919.

The indictments were returned after a lengthy investigation in which it was said army officers from El Paso, Texas, appeared as witnesses.

Alfred J. Peters and Jagers, who had been under arrest some months, were held to answer to the federal grand jury several weeks ago.

CRACK INFANTRY BAND COMING TO OGDEN ARMISTICE DAY

The crack Twenty-first infantry band of Fort Douglas will in all probability be one of the four bands engaged to play here on Armistice day during the celebration which has been arranged by the American Legion.

Director Benton of the Twenty-first is now in Ogden with his band and several concerts were held at various parts of the city today. They are on recruiting duty and are expected to return here for the gala celebration.

Portugal Has Not Granted Naval Base In Azores to U. S.

LISBON, Oct. 27.—The premier of Portugal, Senor Cardoso, informed the Associated Press today that there was no truth in the report that Portugal had granted to the United States a naval base in the Azores. The premier said:

"Portugal went to war to conserve the integrity of her colonies, and she will never part with any of them."

"Should the United States apply for a navy base in the Azores, it would be impossible for the government to grant it, as it would give the United States preponderance in the archipelago."

MADRID, Monday, Oct. 27.—Objections by a third power, led to the refusal of Portugal to grant the United States a naval base in the Azores, according to information received here in well-informed circles.

Senhor Gardo, premier of Portugal, has denied the truth of reports that Portugal had granted the United States the right to establish a naval base in the Azores. He hinted that the United States had not asked for such a concession.

Ripe Olives Cause Death of Five Persons at Dinner

DETROIT, Oct. 27.—Seizure of all ripe olives in the stocks of local retail stores was begun today because of the deaths of five persons who attended a dinner last week at which the fruit was served. Chemical analysis showed the olives contained poisonous bacilli.

Nine thousands bottles of the ripe fruit were taken in early seizures and wholesalers were ordered to discontinue sale of both ripe and green olives, while hotels were advised to strike olives from their menus.
