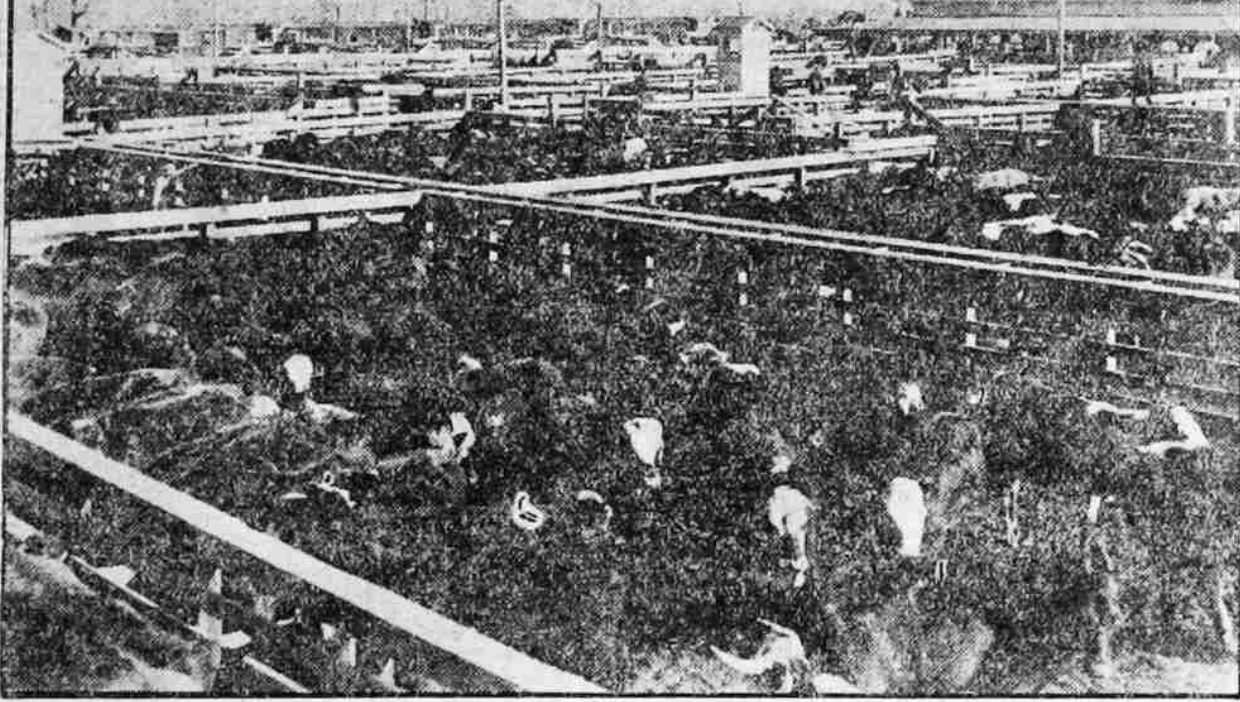


A Position of the Ogden Union Stockyards Where the Big Show Will Be Staged
